Dear Chairman Bryant and Board of Commissioners:

In accordance with the "Local Government Budget & Fiscal Control Act," I am pleased to present a comprehensive spending plan for Halifax County Government for the upcoming fiscal year (FY) of 2018-2019. Further, it fulfills my obligation to present a balanced fiscal plan to you and the citizens of Halifax County. With your direction, this document represents not only a continuation of the many important County services we provide to our constituents but also *reduces* our tax rate by one cent (\$.01) to ensure we provide those services in the most cost-effective manner possible.

What a difference a year makes. Changes at the national, state and local levels remind us that the only constant is change itself. A new federal tax reform bill, rising inflation and an improving economy are but a few of the new horizon issues this year. I'm proud to state that Halifax County is in a solid fiscal position and I expect this trend to continue in the upcoming fiscal year.

Since my tenure began in 2007, Halifax County has met the financial goals necessary to be awarded an A+ bond rating. Additionally, our Finance Department has been the recipient of the Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR) for the past 18 years in a row, which shows the professional level of service we strive to provide to our citizens. Even with these challenges and positives, we still face the realities of managing increased expenditure needs with slowly improving revenue streams; this combination will continue to increase pressures on the local property tax base.

Staff began working on this budget in the fall of 2017 analyzing our many operational, service and capital needs. Working with our dedicated employees, this process included a detailed capital planning process, as well as input from this Board during its retreat in December 2017, which culminated with the Board of Commissioners' direction during April's Budget Work Sessions. I would like to extend a special thanks to our management team, elected officials, department/agency directors and also our educational partners for their continued dedication to a conservative and fiscally responsible approach to this budget process. As always, this budget strives to meet the Commissioners' mission, which is to "Provide leadership and support for an effective county government that seeks to enhance the quality of life for all the people of Halifax County."

With our ever-increasing expenses and revenues that cannot keep pace, we continue to have budget challenges. However, I do remain positive about the County's overall fiscal and economic outlook in addressing this upcoming FY 2018-2019 budget. Fortunately, we continue to slowly recover from the recession which began almost ten years ago. With this recovery, we

have experienced some growth which has aided in allowing us to maintain our level of services and still maintain a healthy Fund Balance to address any unforeseen or unexpected emergencies. I commend both the Board of Commissioners on your conservative budget oversight and county staff for holding the line on their spending needs to absolute essentials.

This recommended budget was developed in the same successful revenue-based budgeting process we have used for the past 18 years. This revenue-based budget has allowed us to weather the economic challenges we have faced since 2008. Since that time, we have used \$18,854,910 from Fund Balance to balance our budgets. Fortunately, we have been able to replenish our Fund Balance with our outstanding budgeting process with conservative projections and unspent funds each year. Use of Fund Balance in this manner has prevented the County from imposing a property tax increase to address operational needs...I'm proud to note that our revenue-based budgeting allows us to have this ability.

Our ability to sustain operations during the recession with no tax increase, except for the construction of Manning Elementary School, shows the importance of maintaining a healthy Fund Balance. This not only assists us during emergencies, but aids in maintaining services during hard times as well...this could not be more evident than in Halifax County over these past ten years. Halifax County has always had challenges in being able to provide services to its citizens while keeping the property tax rate low. Compared to our nearby counties listed below, Halifax County's tax rate is lower than the average rate of \$.82 and is lower than all but three of the other nine counties, placing us in the lower 40% percentile. The chart below shows the FY 2017-18 comparisons:

I commend our staff in each department for their ability to adapt to our ever-changing economic situation. Our staff remains committed to providing efficient and effective services to our citizens at the lowest cost to all taxpayers; as I continually remind our citizens in my conversation about our local government, we are taxpayers as well and also wish to keep our tax burden low.

The economy is improving in many areas across the nation and in North Carolina, but when considering specific improvement areas, many maps show that urban areas have totally recovered from the recession while rural areas are far from their pre-recession economies. This is especially true in North Carolina and has been obvious in many property revaluation processes. Almost all rural counties had a drop in their overall tax base during their last revaluation, including Halifax County which saw an overall average drop in value of 7% in 2015. Despite these economic challenges and slow recovery from the recession, I am happy to report that we continue to maintain our current service levels.

We have experienced growth in some of our major revenue streams. Our year-to-date sales tax revenue has increased 6.72%. I am also proud to state that we have maintained our current tax collection rate at 97.50%, a contender with last year's 97.99% rate. Considering the fact that Halifax County continues to remain a Tier 1 County along with the never-ending economic challenges we face, this is an amazing feat. Our continued excellent collection rate is a credit to the diligent staffs of Doris Hawkins and Shane Lynch in the Tax Office, Sheriff Wes Tripp of the Sheriff's Office and Attorney Glynn Rollins of the Legal Office. The support staff in each of these offices go above and beyond in working with taxpayers in establishing payment plans to aid citizens and minimize hardships. We are not required to do this, we do this to support our citizens. I offer my heartfelt thanks for the jobs the staff in each of these departments accomplish every day.

Also, despite our Tier 1 status, we continue to have positive motion in our economic development efforts. I applaud the Board of Commissioners' forward-thinking and proactive approach in aligning the County to create well-paying jobs in the future as evidenced by the expected opening of Klausner this summer to eventually have 350 jobs when all work shifts are fully operating. Along with support from our Economic Development Commission, its Executive Director, and your positive approach, we are poised to rebound quickly as the economic conditions improve. Despite the uncertain economy, we must continue to aggressively collect taxes and exercise conservative fiscal discipline while still maintaining a responsive and customer-focused workforce. We must also continue to maintain an active economic development program to expand job opportunities, which provides wages at a level to support our families in Halifax County.

Based on our sound approach to our budgets over the years, the County's financial reserves remain well above the 8% level required by the Local Government Commission of the State of North Carolina. I am proud that we have had sound budget practices over my last 11 years as your County Manager and over the last 16 years in this office, which has allowed for a stable Total Fund Balance, which in-turn has allowed the County to address emergency and crisis situations. With our cash reserves, this budget allocates \$1,479,604 which includes Article 44 funds and support for employees and outside requests. This use of Fund Balance is in addition to maintaining the cuts and reductions made by our departments over the last nine fiscal years. Despite the use of Fund Balance, our projected "working" Fund Balance reserves will be 7%. Our audited actual Total Fund Balance as of June 30, 2017 was 45.86%, well above the 8% level

required by the Local Government Commission allowing the County to have fiscal stability and also allowing for an adequate response to any emergencies that could occur during the year.

As required by the State of North Carolina, all counties with multiple graded school districts are required to support each district equally as to local current expense funding based on each district's average daily membership (ADM). Counties must also provide funding for school capital needs. This year's budget provides additional funding for our public schools and community college totaling \$936,153 broken down in the following amounts:

Halifax Community College	\$186,153
Halifax County Schools	\$200,000
Roanoke Rapids Graded School District	\$200,000
Weldon City Schools	\$200,000
Graded Schools Current Expense (ADM-based)	\$150,000

This additional money resulted from sales tax revenues collected and distributed to the County based on G.S. 105-524 (Article 44). The current allocation is the result of collections for the last two years. Going forward each fiscal year, the Halifax County Board of Commissioners will determine whether and how to appropriate these Article 44 funds, which are limited to economic development, public education or community college purposes.

All three graded school systems will receive funding based on the supplemental school property rate within their respective districts. The following tax rates are anticipated for each of the schools systems:

 Halifax County Schools
 \$.10/\$100 value

 Roanoke Rapids Graded School District
 \$.225/\$100 value

 Weldon City Schools
 \$.20/\$100 value

Because we distribute local sales and use taxes by the *ad valorem* method all three districts receive a portion of these revenues.

Though we continue many reductions we have made during the recession, we have been able to maintain our service levels to meet the needs of our citizens. Our County departments continue to operate efficiently and cost-effectively. The staff and I are committed to evaluating our programs and will continue to pursue cost-saving measures to get the biggest bang for our buck.

Halifax County has many capital needs. This budget continues to address our most pressing capital needs by funding, among other things, debt service payments for the Enfield-Inborden School Project, the Social Services facility and Water Service Line construction, in addition to the Solid Waste Transfer Station.

Important features of the budget proposal for Halifax County for FY 2018-2019 are as follows:

- This budget continues County services at efficient and effective levels.
- This budget includes a property tax decrease of one cent (\$.01/\$100).
- This budget is based on an estimated property tax base of \$3,205,837,922 and a tax collection rate of 97.50%. The tax rate of \$.77 cents per \$100 value will be adequate to support the fiscal year 2018-2019 budget.
- This budget improves funding for each graded school district by increasing the per pupil amount by \$23.00 per student based on the Average Daily Membership (ADM).
- This budget provides an employee Competitive Market Adjustment of 2.5% for full-time employees.
- To maintain a healthy workforce, this budget continues to provide a competitive benefits package that includes 100% paid premiums for Health Coverage for each full-time employee who participates in the County's Wellness Program.
- This budget provides each employee a step-increase to allow for progression within their salary grade.
- This budget funds the County's Pay for Performance Plan, which is a vital retention tool in support of our full-time employees.
- This budget maintains our Longevity Pay Program which is an additional employee retention program to reward our long-term full-time employees.
- This budget continues our hiring freeze, previous staff reductions and travel restrictions which will remain in effect throughout this budget year.
- This budget implements a vehicle replacement plan for the Sheriff's Office.
- This budget includes money to support both economic development and contingency operations.
- This budget continues to require employees to use County vehicles, when available, for travel; this policy amounts to a savings of over 60% in travel costs versus paying mileage for use of personal vehicles.
- This budget funds critical capital outlay for County departments.
- This budget provides additional funding to our non-profit community partners in the amount of \$317,566.

Historically we have had difficult budget situations in Halifax County, the past few years of this budget planning process have been especially challenging in playing catch up on addressing needs that have been delayed based on our reduced revenues. Fortunately, this year will be our best year of recovery since the recession. However, even today, there are unknowns in the areas

of lottery revenues, sales tax distributions, allowable 9-1-1 fund expenses, as well as many others that could affect this and upcoming budgets.

This proposed budget shows the County's ability to provide excellent services to its citizens. However, this budget only addresses items of which we, the County, have full control. There will always be the potential for changes from both the Federal and State Government as well as potential changes in the economy. Staff and I will continue to work diligently with the North Carolina Association of County Commissioners (NCACC) and the National Association of Counties (NACo) in communicating our concerns to both our State and Federal Legislators to ensure they are aware of the potential implications of their decisions on Halifax County.

I applaud this Board of Commissioners for recognizing the importance of rewarding our employees. County government is only as good as the human capital that supports its services and we must recognize the changing environment in which that human capital works. We are in an increasing mobile society and we must keep attuned and adapt to the changes by our competitors for our available pool of talent. As I have stated before, I expect employees to depart for promotional opportunities if they are currently not available in Halifax County, but departures for lateral moves for additional compensation is a disservice to not only the employee, but to the County and leaves us continually in the "training ground" mode. I thank each Commissioner for acknowledging this fact and supporting the importance of addressing our human capital needs.

As required by law, the budget will be available for public inspection in the Clerk to the Board's office and in all five County public libraries for the required 10 days. A public hearing will be held on Monday, June 4th at 9:30 a.m. with a final adoption scheduled for Monday, June 18th at 9:30 a.m. After the May 21st meeting, the proposed budget will be available on the County's website at www.halifaxnc.com.

I thank you for the opportunity you have given me to be a public servant to this great community we call Halifax County. I appreciate your support, guidance and encouragement as I and staff continue to grow in our service to our citizens. It continues to be a rewarding experience to work with such dedicated County employees who always amaze me with their ability to do more with less while maintaining their commitment to working hard and serving our Halifax County citizens. I would especially like to thank the strong support that I received from our core Management Team: Deputy County Manager, Dia Denton; Finance Director, Mary Duncan; Interim Human Resources Management Director, Linda Taylor, County Attorney, Glynn Rollins, Clerk to the Board/Assistant to the County Manager, Andrea Wiggins and our newest budget guru, Senior Management Analyst, Ian Bumgarner. These team members are the gas and oil to our Halifax County Government engine. I also want to additionally thank our employees with their can-do attitude. Knowing our challenges, our employees do have an efficiency mindset and continue to look for ways to improve while still providing a phenomenal level of service; this strong sense of public service is proven to me daily in my interactions with all of our great employees. It is always my desire to provide strong leadership and take a fiscally sound approach to maintaining and improving the quality of life for our citizens. Our goal in Halifax County is to

provide a better place to live, work, play and improve life for all of our residents. As has been our catch phrase over the last 10+ years..."Working Together Works" and I'm honored to be a part of a team that practices and lives out the meaning of these words every day. On behalf of our 575 citizen servants, I am honored to present this proposed budget to the Halifax County Board of Commissioners for FY 2018-2019 and stand ready to assist you in continuing to move the County forward.

This was the 18th consecutive year the County had received this prestigious award which was the highest form of recognition in the area of governmental accounting and financial reporting. The receipt of this award was a significant accomplishment by the County and its management.

Mary W. Duncan, Finance Director, accepted the June 30, 2017 Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting that was presented by the Government Finance Officer's Association.

C. Sons of the American Revolution Law Enforcement Commendation Medal -Deputy Corey L. Dixon, Sheriff's Office

Ken Wilson, Sons of the American Revolution, recognized and presented Corey L. Dixon, Halifax County Law Enforcement Officer, with the Sons of the American Revolution Law Enforcement Commendation Medal for outstanding performance and dedication to duty.

3. <u>Public Hearing</u>

A. Halifax County FY 2018-2019 Budget

Tony N. Brown, County Manager, addressed the Board stating that at the May 21, 2018 Regular Meeting, the proposed FY 2018-2019 Budget was presented to the Board and laid on the table for 10 days.

Chairman Bryant inquired if there were any questions from the Board regarding the FY 2018-2019 Budget. With there being no questions from the Board, Commissioner Manning moved to open the public hearing. Commissioner Johnson seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

Chairman Bryant inquired if there were any questions from the public regarding the FY 2018-2019 Budget.

After comments were received from William Hodge, 425 Rightmyer Drive, Roanoke Rapids, Commissioner Smith moved to close the Public Hearing. Commissioner Brewer

seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

4. <u>Agenda Items</u>

A. Halifax Community College Funding Request

Dr. Michael A. Elam, Halifax Community College President, addressed the Board regarding a request for funds in the amount of \$75,000. During the February 19, 2018 Regular Meeting, the Board raised a series of questions regarding a request from the college for additional funds in the amount of \$188,000 for operational expenses. Since that time, the County had provided its proposed FY 2018-2019 Budget that partially addressed the budget shortfall; however, additional funds were needed in the amount of \$75,000. An effort to answer the previous questions of the Board were as follows: The decisions regarding the Connect NC Bond funds were made prior to Dr. Elam's tenure to split \$6.5 Million for construction and renovations/repairs. The Connect NC Bond guidelines for expenditures were very specific and significant progress had been made in regards to spending these funds. College enrollment had declined in curriculum but had increased in the Early College Program; therefore, efforts were made to align the institutional and student success with allocating resources to support program growth and increase enrollment to meet industry demands. The management of the college budget included a reduction in spending and restructured service contracts/rental agreements that resulted in saving approximately \$70,000.

The initial FY 2018-2019 Halifax Community College Budget included \$1,112,851 for current expense and \$255,027 for capital outlay in the total amount of \$1,367,878. The Halifax Community College County allocation for the FY 2017-2018 was in the amount of \$1,293,378. This was an increase in the FY 2018-2019 Budget in the amount of \$74,500. The total proposed capital outlay for FY 2018-2019 was in the amount of \$255,027 and was comprised of \$186,000 for special projects capital from the Article 44 Sales Tax Redistribution along with \$55,077 for building alterations and \$13,950 for equipment. An additional \$60,000 was proposed to increase the operational budget to address utility expenses. In addition to the \$74,500 increase, the Halifax Community College worked to reduce its operating budget; however, without the additional \$75,000, the college would begin FY 2018-2019 without sufficient funds to meet its operational needs. It was requested that the Board approve the Halifax Community College request for \$75,000.

Commissioner Johnson moved to approve the Halifax Community College request for \$75,000 to be added to the County current fund and that the Halifax Community College operate within its budget.

B. Halifax County Parks and Recreation Advisory Board Presentation

Audrey Hardy, Halifax County Parks and Recreation Advisory Board Chairman, addressed the Board and provided a brief PowerPoint presentation regarding the activities of the Halifax County Parks and Recreation Advisory Board and funding recommendations for establishing a County Parks and Recreation Department, hire a Parks and Recreation Director and establish three regional parks. It was requested that the Board consider funding a County Parks and Recreation Department by utilizing the one cent tax decrease included in the proposed FY 2018-2019 Halifax County Budget.

C. Halifax County Schools Lottery Funds Request

Tony Alston, Halifax County Schools Director of School Operations, addressed the Board requesting lottery funds in the amount of \$215,000 for the following projects: ceiling tiles and floor covering at Hollister Elementary School and Pittman Elementary School \$65,000 and interior and exterior painting at Hollister Elementary School, Pittman Elementary School, and Southeast Halifax High School \$150,000.

Commissioner Brewer moved to approve the lottery funds requests in the amount of \$215,000. Commissioner Qualls seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

D. Roanoke Rapids Graded School District Lottery Funds Request

Dr. Dain Butler, Roanoke Rapids Graded School District Superintendent, addressed the Board and requested lottery funds to purchase a parcel of land owned by Kenny Hale, Hale Plumbing Inc., located adjacent to the new Manning Elementary School in the amount of \$150,000, plus any associated closing costs, that would be used to expand parking for the Manning Elementary School in the amount of \$155,000. Once the Hale property sale was completed, the house currently located on the property would need to be removed. If the County was not interested in purchasing the house, the Roanoke Rapids Graded School District Board of Trustees could proceed with disposal pursuant to N. C. G. S. \$115C-518 and Chapter 160A.

Commissioner Qualls moved to approve the lottery funds request to purchase a parcel of land owned by Kenny Hale, Hale Plumbing Inc., in the amount of \$155,000. Commissioner Smith seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

Commissioner Qualls moved to waive the right of first refusal. Commissioner Manning seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

E. Acceptance of a Vehicle from Dominion Energy North Carolina

Sheriff S. Wes Tripp, Sheriff's Office, addressed the Board requesting approval to accept a retired vehicle from Dominion Energy North Carolina. The vehicle was a 2009 Chevrolet Colorado Extra Cab 4 x 4 Truck, vehicle identification number 1GCDT19E898124044. The only County cost in regards to the receipt of the vehicle would be taxes and tags in the amount of \$190.20.

Commissioner Manning moved to approve the receipt of a 2009 Chevrolet Colorado Extra Cab 4 x 4 Truck from Dominion Energy North Carolina. Commissioner Brewer seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

F. Child Fatality Prevention Team Annual Report

Bruce L. Robistow, Public Health Director, addressed the Board stating that the 2017 Child Fatality Prevention Team Annual Report was being submitted for informational purposes only, as required by the State Child Health Contract Addenda. The report contained specific case information and recommendations on cases reviewed by the Child Fatality Prevention Team regarding child fatalities that occurred in 2017. There were no new member appointments to the Child Fatality Prevention Team. It was requested that the Board accept the Child Fatality Prevention Team Annual Report.

Commissioner Manning moved to accept the Child Fatality Prevention Team Annual Report. Commissioner Brewer seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

G. 2018-2019 Home and Community Care Block Grant Funding Plan

Rose B. Lewis, Human Resources Management, addressed the Board regarding the FY 2018-2019 Home and Community Care Block Grant Funding Plan. The Halifax County Council on Aging received notice that the 2018-2019 Home and Community Care Block Grant would be in the amount of \$598,014. The Home and Community Care Block Grant Advisory Committee met and agreed to fund six of the current providers. A 10% match was required by all providers and the County provided the 10% cash match for the Council on Aging in the amount of \$9,197 and a 10% in-kind match in the amount of \$9,552. The Department of Social Services required 10% in-kind match in the amount of \$31,569. The funds for the Home and Community Care Block Grant County Funding Plan were contingent upon the balancing of the State's budget and once the funding plan and grant agreement were in place any changes to the grant would be provided to the County Manager to be included in the Weekly Update. It was requested that the Board approve the 2018-2019 Home and Community Care Block Grant Funding Plan.

Commissioner Manning moved to approve the 2018-2019 Home and Community Care Block Grant Funding Plan. Commissioner Brewer seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

H. Ash Monofill Final Cover Project

Greg Griffin, Public Utilities Director, addressed the Board regarding the Ash Monofill Final Cover Project. The County had been notified that the coal ash disposal site owned and operated by the County for the disposal of coal combustion residue produced by the Roanoke Valley Energy Facility in Weldon would not receive additional material. In order to comply with North Carolina Department of Environment Quality regulations the inactive disposal site must be stabilized and protected with a final cover consisting of a geomembrane and soil composite cover. A request for qualifications was presented for engineering services for the project and Smith Gardner Engineers, Inc., was selected as the most qualified firm. Smith Gardner, Inc., submitted a proposal for engineering services in the amount of \$218,000, which included a 5% contingency. All costs associated with the Ash Monofill Final Cover Project were subject to reimbursement by Westmoreland Coal Company. A project budget ordinance, which is attached to these minutes as Attachment E, the engineering proposal from Smith Gardner, Inc., and a supplemental agreement defining the conditions for reimbursement of County expenditures by Westmoreland was presented for review and approval.

Commissioner Brewer moved to approve the Ash Monofill Final Cover Project Ordinance, the proposal for engineering services from Smith Gardner, Inc., and the supplemental agreement between Halifax County and Westmoreland. Commissioner Johnson seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

I. Accounts Receivable Write-Offs

Mary W. Duncan, Finance Director, addressed the Board requesting authorization to write-off uncollected debt in the total amount of \$1,407,882.38 as follows: Health \$4,224.86; EMS \$1,392,570.29; and Public Utilities Water \$4,901.77 and Solid Waste \$6,185.46. Independent auditors had requested that uncollectible debts be written off in order to accurately reflect year-end receivables. All debts were incurred prior to July 1, 2016 and were in compliance with the Halifax County Write-off Policy adopted May 6, 2002. Southern Credit Adjusters would continue to pursue EMS, Water, and Health Department collections through the State's debt set-off program.

Commissioner Johnson moved to authorize write-offs in the amount of \$1,407,882.38 in uncollected debt for Health, EMS and Public Utilities Water and Solid Waste. Commissioner Brewer seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

J. New Public Safety Answering Point Resolution and Interlocal Agreement

Dia H. Denton, Deputy County Manager, addressed the Board requesting the adoption of a resolution and interlocal agreement for the new Public Safety Answering Point. County staff was moving forward with plans to locate a new Primary Public Safety Answering Point, 911 Center, on Ferrell Lane that would also serve as a regional backup center for Warren and Franklin counties. In order to formalize this relationship, it would be necessary to enter into interlocal agreements with both counties outlining each county's responsibilities. The adoption of the resolution, which is attached to these minutes as Attachment F, would designate personnel authority to execute the interlocal agreement on behalf of their respective county. The documents would be submitted to the North Carolina 911 Board as part of the revised County application for funding the facility. The appropriate County staff would be attending the county commissioners meetings of Warren and Franklin counties to receive approval of the documents.

Commissioner Smith moved to approve the new Public Safety Answering Point resolution and interlocal Agreement. Commissioner Qualls seconded the motion, which passed

unanimously by voice vote.

5. <u>Board Appointments</u>

Adult Care Home Advisory Committee

Commissioner Smith moved to reappoint Prudence Boseman to serve on the Adult Care Home Advisory Committee, term expiring June 30, 2021. Commissioner Brewer seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

Commissioner Qualls moved to waive the term limit and reappoint Johnny Draper, Jr. to serve on the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board, term expiring June 30, 2021. Commissioner Johnson seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

Economic Development Board

Commissioner Smith moved to waive the term limits and reappoint Hugh Bazemore and J. Rives Manning, Jr., to serve on the Economic Development Board, terms expiring June 30, 2021. Commissioner Qualls seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

Commissioner Johnson moved to reappoint Johnny Draper, Jr., Daniel Fouts, Jr., and Robert Sykes to serve on the Economic Development Board, terms expiring June 30, 2021. Commissioner Brewer seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

EMS Advisory Committee

It was the consensus of the Board to defer action on the EMS Advisory Committee.

Five County Community Operations Center Oversight Board

Commissioner Manning moved to reappoint Marcelle Smith to serve on the Five County Community Operations Center Oversight Board, term expiring June 30, 2021. Commissioner Johnson seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

Halifax Community College Board of Trustees

Commissioner Manning moved to appoint Robin Lancaster to replace Stanley Edwards on the Halifax Community College Board of Trustees, term expiring June 30, 2022. Commissioner Qualls seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

Halifax County Council on Aging

Commissioner Smith moved to reappoint Ernestine Ware to serve on the Halifax County Council on Aging, term expiring June 30, 2021. Commissioner Johnson seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

Commissioner Johnson moved to waive the term limits and reappoint Greg Browning, Undine Garner, and Marion Lewis to serve on the Halifax County Council on Aging, terms expiring June 30, 2021. Commissioner Brewer seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

Library Board

Commissioner Johnson moved to reappoint Robert Alexander to serve on the Library Board, term expiring June 30, 2021. Commissioner Smith seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

Commissioner Manning moved to waive the term limits and reappoint Tessie Hofmann-Brady and C. K. Wilson to serve on the Library Board, terms expiring June 30, 2021. Commissioner Johnson seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

Nursing Home Advisory Committee

Cathy A. Scott, Economic Development Director, addressed the Board and provided a brief PowerPoint presentation regarding the monthly Halifax County Economic Development Commission Activity Report.

A. Resolution to Authorize the County Manager and Department of Social Services Director to Execute Annual North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services Agreements

M. Glynn Rollins, Jr., County Attorney, addressed the Board regarding a resolution to authorize the County Manager and the Department of Social Services Director to execute annual Department of Health and Human Services agreements. Effective July 1, 2018, N. C. G. S. 108A-74, as amended by Session Law 2017-41, required all counties to enter into an annual written agreement with the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services that specified mandated performance requirements and administrative responsibilities for most social services programs. These annual agreements would provide for certain corrective action, including potential for loss of funding or takeover of administration of social services programs, if the agency failed to meet performance measures or otherwise defaults on the terms and

conditions of the agreement. The essential terms and conditions of the annual agreement were not subject to negotiation, but the performance measures may be adjusted from time to time, depending on circumstances. It was recommended that the County Manager and the Department of Social Services Director be given joint authority to execute these annual performance agreements, on the condition that (1) all notices regarding failure in performance be issued principally to the county manager, and (2) that the county manager immediately report any such notice to the Board. The proposed resolution, which is attached to these minutes as Attachment J, and the most recent draft of the annual agreement that had been distributed to all 100 counties by the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services were provided for review. It was requested that the Board adopt the resolution authorizing the County Manager and the Department of Social Services Director to execute the mandated annual performance agreements with the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services.

Commissioner Manning moved to adopt the resolution authorizing the County Manager and the Department of Social Services Director to execute the mandated annual performance agreements with the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services. Commissioner Qualls seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

B. Right-of-Way Agreement to Dominion Energy North Carolina

M. Glynn Rollins, Jr., County Attorney, addressed the Board regarding a right-of-way agreement to Dominion Energy North Carolina. In order to establish a separate electrical power source and back-up generator for Central Communications 911 equipment on the tower located at the end of Ferrell Lane, Dominion Energy North Carolina requested that the existing easement at the tower site be widened to 30 feet. A copy of the proposed right-of-way agreement was provided for review. It was requested that the Board approve the right-of-way agreement to Dominion Energy North Carolina and to authorize the appropriate staff to execute the documents.

Commissioner Manning moved to approve the right-of-way agreement to Dominion Energy North Carolina and to authorize the appropriate staff to execute the documents. Commissioner Brewer seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

C. Legal Department Part-time Office Assistant Position to a Fulltime Position

M. Glynn Rollins, Jr., County Attorney, addressed the Board and requested that the parttime Office Assistant position in the Legal Department become a fulltime position. Upon approval of this request, the Halifax County Budget Ordinance, Section 65, would be amended to reflect three fulltime positions in the Legal Department.

Commissioner Manning moved to approve that the part-time Office Assistant position in the Legal Department become a fulltime position. Commissioner Brewer seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

9. <u>Other Business</u>

A. Resolution Honoring Halifax County Centenarian Ruth Hilliard

Chairman Bryant requested that the Board adopt the resolution honoring Halifax County Centenarian Ruth Hilliard, which is attached to these minutes as Attachment K.

Commissioner Smith moved to adopt the resolution honoring Halifax County Centenarian Ruth Hilliard. Commissioner Brewer seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

10. <u>Closed Session</u>

There were no matters to be discussed in Closed Session.

11. <u>Announcement – Halifax Community College Tour</u>

Chairman Bryant announced that the Board would be leaving the Historic Courthouse at approximately 12:00 Noon to attend a Halifax Community College tour.



A RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE THE COUNTY MANAGER AND THE COUNTY DIRECTOR OF SOCIAL SERVICES TO EXECUTE ANNUAL WRITTEN AGREEMENTS WITH THE NORTH CAROLINA DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES

WHEREAS, effective July 1, 2018, G.S. 108A-74 (as amended by Session Law 2017-41) requires all counties to enter into an annual written agreement with the N. C. Department of Health and Human Services ("DHHS") that specifies mandated performance requirements and administrative responsibilities for all social services programs excluding medical assistance (Medicaid); and

WHEREAS, as mandated by law, these annual agreements will provide for certain corrective action, including potential for loss of funding or takeover of administration of social services programs, in the event of failure to meet performance measures or otherwise default on the terms and conditions set forth in the agreement; and

WHEREAS, the essential terms and conditions of the annual agreements are not subject to negotiation, nor is a county given the option of refusing to enter into an annual agreement; and

WHEREAS, the County Manager and the County Director of Social Services are best positioned to consider the various terms and conditions of these performance agreements as they are presented from year to year by DHHS, without the need to bring such matters before the Board of County Commissioners for prior approval; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Board of County Commissioners to specifically delegate authority to the County Manager and the County Director of Social Services to execute these annual agreements on behalf of Halifax County without prior approval of the Board;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED as follows:

1. The County Manager and the County Director of Social Services, jointly, but not severally, shall have the authority to execute annual written agreements with the N. C. Department of Health and Human Services ("DHHS") specifying mandated performance requirements and administrative responsibilities for all county social services programs excluding medical assistance (Medicaid), as required by G.S. 108A-74, and thereby bind the County to the terms and conditions set forth in those agreements from year to year.

The County Manager shall be the principal point of contact for all notices related to nonperformance or other default with regard to these annual agreements.

3. The County Manager shall immediately report any notice of nonperformance or default to the Board of County Commissioners, including remedial action to be taken with respect to such nonperformance or default.



Call to Order

Invocation and Pledge of Allegiance

Commissioner Qualls provided the invocation and the Pledge of Allegiance was then recited.

Adoption of the Agenda

Commissioner Smith requested that the subject of prayer in open meetings be added to the agenda under Other Business.

Commissioner Smith moved to approve the agenda as amended. Commissioner Manning seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

Conflict of Interest

There was no conflict of interest noted by any member of the Board.

1. <u>Consent Agenda</u>

Commissioner Qualls moved to approve the following items on the consent agenda. Commissioner Smith seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

A. Approval of Minutes

Andrea H. Wiggins, Clerk to the Board, requested that the Board approve the draft minutes of the June 5, 2017 Regular Meeting, June 19, 2017 Regular Meeting, and July 10, 2017 Regular Meeting.

B. Property Tax Refunds and Releases - June 2018

Doris B. Hawkins, Halifax County Tax Coordinator and Collector, requested that the Board approve the property tax releases in accordance with G. S. §105-380 and G. S. §105-381. Approval of the releases was required for the records to stand corrected. The following were the tax bills that required release during the month of June 2018, but did not require a refund. The seven accounts for tax years 2014-2017 were in the total amount of \$15,113.69. Real property consisted of one reduced real property value due to a timely appeal with the Assessor. Personal property listing, one business closed in 2016, one corrected value for a 2017 bill, and one reduced real property value due to a timely appeal with the Assessor.

The refund was as follows: Deborah Sue Lloyd c/o Halifax County Tax Department. Post Office 68, Halifax, North Carolina 27839, parcel 1103033. Solid Waste Availability Fee was charged in error as follows: 2012 ASF \$41.75, 2013 ASF \$33.89, 2014 ASF \$41.75, 2015 ASF \$57.76, 2016 ASF \$59.25, and 2017 ASF \$40.60. The refund in the total amount of \$275 was returned to the Tax Department to be applied to the 2017 and 2018 tax bills for account 82019.

2. <u>Agenda Items</u>

A. Wanda Clements-Spence, 2018 Elderly or Disabled Exclusion Application

C. Shane Lynch, County Assessor, addressed the Board regarding a 2018 late application for property tax relief concerning the elderly or disabled exclusion for Wanda Clements-Spence, parcel 0911070. North Carolina excluded from property taxes a portion of the appraised value of a permanent residence owned and occupied by North Carolina residents who were at least 65 years of age or were totally and permanently disabled and whose income did not exceed \$29,600. Applications for the elderly or disabled exclusion were due June 1 of the tax year; however, Ms. Clements-Spence application for exemption was received June 6, 2018. The Tax Department reviewed the application and had it been received before the deadline it would have been approved. The elderly and disabled exclusion application, letter from Mrs. Clements-Spence requesting consideration for late approval, N. C. G. S. 105-277.1(c) noting the application were provided for the Board's review. It was requested that the Board determine whether to accept the late 2018 application for the elderly or disabled property tax relief exclusion for Wanda Spence Clements, parcel 0911070.

Commissioner Qualls moved to approve the 2018 late application for property tax relief concerning the elderly or disabled exclusion for Wanda Clements-Spence, parcel 0911070. Commissioner Manning seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

B. Colleen Dickens, 2018 Elderly or Disabled Exclusion Application

C. Shane Lynch, Tax Assessor, addressed the Board regarding a 2018 late application for property tax relief concerning the elderly or disabled exclusion for Colleen Dickens, parcel 1101397. North Carolina excluded from property taxes a portion of the appraised value of a permanent residence owned and occupied by North Carolina residents who were at least 65 years of age or were totally and permanently disabled and whose income does not exceed \$29,600. Applications for the elderly or disabled exclusion were due June 1 of the tax year; however, Ms. Dickens' application for exemption was received on June 8, 2018. The Tax Department reviewed the application and had it been received before the deadline it would have been approved. The elderly and disabled exclusion application, letter from Ms. Dickens requesting consideration for late approval, N. C. G. S. 105-277.1(c) noting the application deadline of June 1, and the N. C. G. S. 105-282.1(a1) which addressed the late application were provided for the Board's review. It was requested that the Board determine whether to accept the late 2018 application for the property tax relief concerning the elderly or disabled exclusion for Colleen Dickens, parcel 1101397.

Commissioner Manning moved to approve the late 2018 application for property tax relief concerning the elderly or disabled exclusion for Colleen Dickens, parcel 1101397. Commissioner Smith seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

C. 2017 Property Tax Settlement, Report of Insolvents, and Authorize Order for Tax Collector to Collect Taxes Doris B. Hawkins, Tax Collector, addressed the Board and requested approval of the 2017 Property Tax Settlement, Report of Insolvents, and to charge the Tax Collector with collection responsibility for the next fiscal year. A brief PowerPoint presentation and a spreadsheet that documented the FY 2017-2018 levy from beginning levy to year-end was provided. The levy by property category for FY 2017-2018 was as follows: real property \$22,065,669.21, 89%, and personal property \$2,857,303.66, 11%. The collection percentage by category was as follows: real property levy 97.71%, personal property levy 98.79%, and the total combined levy 97.83%. It was requested that the Board approve the 2017 Report of Insolvents in the amount of \$124,376.73, which did not include motor vehicles.

Commissioner Qualls moved to approve the 2017 Property Tax Settlement, Report of Insolvents, and to charge the Tax Collector with collection responsibility for the next fiscal year. Commissioner Manning seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

D. Additional Law Enforcement Officer 401K Position

Sheriff S. Wes Tripp, Sheriff Office, addressed the Board and requested approval of a Law Enforcement Officer 401K position to be utilized as a School Resource Officer at the Northwest High School. This position would be a Deputy I, grade 65, step 15 in the amount of \$54,278.28, and would be reimbursed by the Halifax County Schools Board of Education. This position was considered to be similar to a grant funded position in that when the funding goes away the position would also go away. It was requested that the Board approve a Law Enforcement Officer 401K position to be utilized as a School Resource Officer at the Northwest High School.

Commissioner Qualls moved to approve a Law Enforcement Officer 401K position to be utilized as a School Resource Officer at the Northwest High School. Commissioner Manning seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

Cathy A. Scott, Economic Development Director, addressed the Board and provided a brief PowerPoint presentation regarding the monthly Halifax County Economic Development Commission Activity Report.

5. <u>County Manager's Report</u>

A. NCACC Annual Conference - Designation of Voting Delegate

Tony N. Brown, County Manager, addressed the Board requesting that the Commissioners designate a member to serve as voting delegate at the North Carolina Association of County Commissioners 111th Annual Conference that would be held in Catawba County on August 23-25, 2018.

Commissioner Manning moved to designate J. Rives Manning, Jr. to serve as the County's voting delegate at the North Carolina Association of County Commissioners 111th Annual Conference. Commissioner Qualls seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

B. Halifax County ABC Board Travel Policy

Tony N. Brown, County Manager, addressed the Board requesting approval of the Halifax County ABC Board Travel Policy.

Commissioner Manning moved to approve the ABC Board Travel Policy. Commissioner Qualls seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

6. <u>County Attorney's Report</u>

A. Conflicts of Interest Policy

M. Glynn Rollins, Jr., County Attorney, addressed the Board requesting the adoption of a Conflicts of Interest Policy as new regulations would go into effect regarding federal grants. In preparing for those changes, the Board needed to update the County's Conflicts of Interest Policy. In 2013, a Code of Conduct policy was adopted; however, it only applied to federal grants and needed to be updated. The proposed new Conflicts of Interest Policy would cover all procurement contracts and construction/repair contracts, regardless of the source of funding, which was preferred because the County received State grants that required the County to have an adopted Conflicts of Interest Policy. The 2013 federal grants Code of Conduct policy and the proposed new Conflicts of Interest Policy was provided for the Board's review. It was requested that the Board adopt the proposed Conflicts of Interest Policy.

Commissioner Manning moved to approve the Conflicts of Interest Policy. Commissioner Qualls seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

B. Resolution in Support of an All-Way Stop at N. C. Highway 43 and N. C. Highway 561

M. Glynn Rollins, Jr., County Attorney, addressed the Board and presented a resolution in support of an all-way stop at N. C. Highway 43 and N. C. Highway 561, which is attached to these minutes as Attachment B.

Ronald L. Keeter, Jr., North Carolina Department of Transportation, addressed the Board and introduced Kristin W. Barnes, P. E., District Engineer. Mr. Keeter stated that many calls and emails had been received regarding the safety of the intersection in Essex at N. C. Highway 43 and N. C. Highway 561. The Department of Transportation recommended an all-way stop, which was the most cost-effective improvement and would reduce accidents. It was requested that the Board adopt the resolution in support of an all-way stop at the intersection of N. C. Highway 43 and N. C. Highway 561.

Commissioner Manning moved to adopt the resolution in support of the proposed installation of an all-way stop at N. C. Highway 43 and N. C. Highway 561. Commissioner Qualls seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

The County Attorney recommended that he be allowed to provide the Board with a memorandum regarding all the matters involving the Rowan County case for the Board's review.

Halifax County Parks and Recreation Advisory Board

By-Laws

Article I – Powers and Duties

<u>Section 1.</u> The Halifax County Parks and Recreation Advisory Board shall serve as an Advisory Board to the Halifax County Board of Commissioners with powers set forth by these by-laws adopted by the Advisory Board in consultation with the County Manager and the County Commissioners.

Section 2. The Advisory Board shall make recommendations to the County Manager and the County Commissioners concerning recreation policies, programs, grants, capital expenditures or other issues related to parks and recreation in accordance with the adopted Halifax County Comprehensive Parks and Recreation Master Plan.

Article II – Appointment and Composition of the Board

Section 1. The Advisory Board shall be appointed by the Halifax County Commissioners in accordance with the Halifax County Board Appointment Policy. The Advisory Board shall not exceed fifteen (15) ten (10) members that represent the diverse nature of Halifax County. Vacancies occurring for reasons other than the expiration of terms shall be filled as they occur for the remainder of the unexpired terms.

Section 2. The Advisory Board, at its discretion, may also include ad-hoc members from the community in those situations where it may be beneficial. Examples of this type of community involvement may include individuals with experience in recreation projects. These individuals will be non-voting liaison representatives.

Article III – Officers of the Board

<u>Section 1.</u> There shall be a Chair and a Vice-Chair of the Advisory Board. An election of the Chair and Vice-Chair shall be held by the Board members at the first official meeting and yearly

thereafter. The Deputy County Manager, or his or her appointee, shall serve as Secretary to the Board and will have no vote.

Section 2. Officers shall serve for one year from election with eligibility for re-election. Officers shall be elected each year, with eligibility for re-election, in December and shall serve for one year beginning in January of the following year. New officers shall take office at the subsequent regular meeting after the election. In the event an officer's appointment to the Board is terminated, a replacement to this office shall be elected by the Board, from its membership, at the meeting following termination.

Article IV – Duties of the Officers

Section 1. The Chair shall preside at all meetings and sign all documents relative to action taken by the Board. The Chair shall appoint any committees deemed necessary from time to time by the Board (see Article V).

Section 2. When the Chair is absent, the Vice-Chair shall perform the duties of the Chair. When both the Chair and the Vice-Chair are absent, those Board members who are present shall select a temporary Chair.

Section 3. As the Secretary of the Board, the Deputy County Manager, or his or her appointee, may delegate all or part of the duties to another County Management staff member, but shall hold the office of the Secretary and shall be held responsible for the satisfactory accomplishment of the secretarial duties. The Secretary shall email or mail to all Board members copies of official reports and draft minutes of all regular and special meetings prior to the next scheduled meeting. The Secretary serves as an ex-officio, non-voting officer, and does not make up the majority or a quorum of the Board.

Article V – Committees

<u>Section 1.</u> The Executive Committee shall consist of the Chair, the Vice Chair and the Secretary, and shall be a standing committee. The Secretary has no vote.

Section 2. The Board Chair is authorized to appoint such other standing or ad hoc committees as may be deemed necessary or appropriate by the Board.

<u>Section 3.</u> Membership of the committees shall consist of Board Members and may consist of community representatives appointed by the Board. A Board Member shall chair all committees.

<u>Section 4.</u> The Chair and the Secretary shall serve as ex-officio members of all committees and, as such, shall be notified of the committee meetings.

Article VI – Terms and Vacancies

Section 1. Each member shall be appointed by the Halifax County Commissioners in accordance with the Board Appointment Qualifications and Guidelines. Each member will be appointed to a three-year term and reappointed at the discretion of the County Commissioners. Initial appointments shall be arranged so that approximately one-third of the terms will expire each year. One-third of the initial appointments shall expire after one year, with the understanding that those appointees may be reappointed by the County Commissioners to a new three-year term. An additional one-third of the initial appointments shall expire after two years, with the understanding that those appointees may be reappointees may be reappointed by the County Commissioners to a new three-year term. The final one-third of the initial appointments will have three year terms and will be reappointed at the discretion of the County Commissioners.

Section 2. Each appointee is permitted to serve a maximum of three consecutive terms, except for the initial appointees who are appointed to serve one or two-year terms. Those appointees may serve a maximum of four consecutive terms.

Article VII – Meetings and Quorum

<u>Section 1.</u> Regular meetings of the Board shall be held on a monthly basis on a schedule to be determined by the Board. The Secretary shall publish notice of regular meetings in accordance with the North Carolina Open Meetings Law as amended from time to time.

Section 2. The Chair of the Board or, in his/her absence, the Vice-Chair, may call a special meeting of the Board. In addition, special meetings shall be called upon written request by eight or more a majority of Board members. Each member shall receive a 48 hour notice of any special meeting. The Secretary shall publish notice of special meetings in accordance with the North Carolina Open Meetings Law as amended from time to time.

Section 3. A quorum of the Board shall be in attendance at any meeting before official action may be taken. A quorum is the majority of the presently appointed Board members. Vacancies shall not be counted in determining the presence of a quorum.

Article VIII – Attendance of Members

<u>Section 1.</u> If an appointee, in any calendar year, has unexcused absences which constitute more than 25 percent (25%), or three (3) consecutive meetings of the Board meetings which he or she is required to attend pursuant to his or her appointment, he or she is obligated to resign.

Excused absences are defined as absences caused by events beyond one's control. If the individual refuses to resign, he or she may be dismissed by action of the Board of

Commissioners. A calendar year is defined as a 12-month period beginning on the date of appointment.

Article IX – Supplemental Policies and Procedures, Amendments

<u>Section 1.</u> Operational policies or procedures to supplement these by-laws may be developed and approved by the majority vote of the Board. Such policies and procedures shall be maintained in writing by the Secretary. In the event of a conflict between such policies and procedures with these by-laws, these by-laws shall control.

Section 2. The Board may make recommendations to the Halifax County Board of Commissioners for amendments to these by-laws. Any recommendation for changes to these by-laws may be made at any duly called meeting of the Board. Any proposed amendments to be considered for such recommendation shall be submitted to the Board not less than fifteen (15) days in advance of the meeting. Approved recommendations shall be presented to the Halifax County Board of Commissioners for final adoption.

Article X – Communication with Board of Commissioners

<u>Section1.</u> The Advisory Board may periodically will report bi-annually to the Board of Commissioners any updates regarding grants, projects, or other matters that may be of interest to the County Commissioners to keep them updated on the work of the Advisory Board. The Chair, Vice-Chair or Secretary shall appear before the Board of Commissioners to request official action of the Board to apply for grants or receive official permission before proceeding with any projects requiring County funding or funding to be received by the County.

Article XI – Proxy

Section 1. Proxy voting will not be allowed or recognized at any meeting.

Article XII – Voting

Section 1. Voting members shall consist of the Chair, the Vice-Chair, and the Board Members present and representing the duly established work of the Advisory Board. In the event of a tie vote, the motion fails.

Article XIII – Parliamentary Procedures

Section 1. Parliamentary procedures are adhered to as reflected in the latest edition of Robert's Rules of Order and shall prevail at official meetings of the Board unless otherwise specified by the by-laws.

Article XIV – Diversity

Section 1. The Halifax County Parks and Recreation Advisory Board believes that the membership and leadership should be reflective of the diverse population within Halifax County. Every effort should be made to ensure representation of underrepresented groups.

Article XV – Non-Discrimination

Section 1. The Advisory Board shall not discriminate in any manner against any person or group by reason of race, gender, national origin, ability, sexual orientation, religious or political affiliation.

SUPPORTING INFORMATION:

In the state of North Carolina, businesses are required to list any business related personal property and/or business related improvements to leased real property during the annual listing period each year. When a business does not accurately list their personal property or list it at all, N.C. G.S. 105-312 allows the Assessor to create a discovery bill for the current year and for any of the preceding five years during which it escaped taxation. The same statute allows the Tax Assessor and Tax Collector to add a penalty of ten percent (10%) of the amount of the tax for the earliest year in which the property was not listed, plus an additional ten percent (10%) of the same amount for each subsequent listing period that elapsed before the property was discovered. This statute also gives the Board of Commissioners the authority to compromise, settle, or adjust the taxes and penalty.

The owner of C. D. Williams Construction Company, Inc. has asked the Halifax County Commissioners for any consideration they can give towards the late list penalties applied to his discovery bill. This bill has been penalized to the maximum penalty allowed by law.

See attached letters from the accountant of the property owner for details. Also see the breakdown of penalties and a copy of N. C. G. S. 105-312 regarding discovered property; appraisal; penalty.

Re: Supporting evidence to waive tax penalties for one of the few companies you have left in Halifax County

My defense is simple. I listed my vehicles as I understood the rules, as I was told three times, if it has a plate and is registered with DOT, do not list—the same as each of you do with your plated vehicles. If I was doing wrong, why couldn't the tax office explain these rules a little better or possibly show the general public a rule book? No rule book exists. The tax office by their own words admits IRP registration has many confusing rules. I certainly did not try to hide these big pieces of equipment. Everyone in Halifax County knows I have them. If I was trying to avoid paying taxes, why would I put my name on the side and donate their services at community events, such as "Touch a Truck?" The few rules I have been able to dig up state: Property tax laws require counties to assess the value of motor vehicles registered with DMV and to prepare a tax bill. All of my vehicles are registered with DMV and are tagged. How can I pay a tax bill if I never received a bill? I say the tax office dropped the ball by thinking a truck crane with a plate is the same as a bulldozer with no plate.

Halifax County should take notice of how Chatham County handles IRP tagged vehicles. At least they print out rules that the public can read and understand. I can read and understand starting in January 2018 to list my IRP plated vehicles on my green January listing form in Chatham County. I can find nothing printed out by Halifax County. This only started in 2018. Before that Chatham had the same old system as Halifax County I assume. It states current vehicles meeting IRP criteria are assessed and taxed as part of the normal July tax notice at the time that the tax office receives NC DMV information prior to billing.

More evidence I did not intentionally not list my vehicles straight from the IRP Registration Plan Manual: General Statute 105-330 adopted by the NC General Assembly in 1991 allows the renewal of a license plate to service as a property tax listing for motor vehicles. More evidence that IRP registered vehicles present the Halifax County tax office and me, the general public, with many confusing rules on listing equipment with a license plate for tax purposes. DMV official web site states: IRP vehicles are exempt from property taxes General Statute 20-84.

For the above stated reasons I ask the Commissioners to waive penalties assessed from confusing rules that no one can explain or understand. Please consider, this 50-year old company has paid our fair share of taxes. Halifax County certainly does not need to lose another 50-year old company over tax penalties.

Important Information on International Registration Plan (IRP) Trucking License Plates Effective January 2018

State law now requires that certain vehicles be listed with the Chatham County Tax Office. Any vehicle plate that meets the definition of an International Registration Plan (IRP) must be included on listing forms in January of each year, starting in January 2018.

WHAT IS AN IRP? An IRP is defined as vehicles meeting all of these conditions: 1. Is used or intended for use in two or more member jurisdictions, which includes vehicles crossing ANY of the borders of the U.S. states, the District of Columbia and the ten Canadian provinces.

2. Is used to transport persons for hire, OR is designed, used, or maintained primarily to transport property or goods.

3. Has one of the following:

a. A power unit / trailer having two axles and a gross vehicle weight or registered gross vehicle weight in excess of 26,000 pounds

b. A power unit / trailer having three axles or more regardless of weight

c. When used in combination gross weight of such combination exceeds 26,000 pounds gross vehicle weight AND must travel two or more jurisdictions noted in A. above.

CURRENT SYSTEM ENDS IN 2018: 2017 is the last year of the current format of billing. Current vehicles meeting the IRP criteria are assessed and taxed as part of the normal July tax notice at the time that the Tax Office receives NC Division of Motor Vehicles (NCDMV) information prior to billing. Vehicle information received after billing will be billed in the fall of 2017.

STARTING JANUARY 2018: All IRP plates are to be listed during the January listing period (January 1 – 31).

§ 105-312. Discovered property; appraisal; penalty.

(a) Repealed by Session Laws 1991, c. 34, s. 4.

(b) Duty to Discover and Assess Unlisted Property. – It shall be the duty of the assessor to see that all property not properly listed during the regular listing period be listed, assessed and taxed as provided in this Subchapter. The assessor shall file reports of such discoveries with the board of commissioners in such manner as the board may require.

(c) Carrying Forward Real Property. – At the close of the regular listing period each year, the assessor shall compare the tax lists submitted during the listing period just ended with the lists for the preceding year, and he shall carry forward to the lists of the current year all real property that was listed in the preceding year but that was not listed for the current year. When carried forward, the real property shall be listed in the name of the taxpayer who listed it in the preceding year unless, under the provisions of G.S. 105-302, it must be listed in the name of another taxpayer. Real property carried forward in this manner shall be deemed to be discovered property, and the procedures prescribed in subsection (d), below, shall be followed unless the property discovered is listed in the name of the taxpayer who listed it for the preceding year and the property is not subject to appraisal under either G.S. 105-286 or G.S. 105-287 in which case no notice of the listing and valuation need be sent to the taxpayer.

(d) Procedure for Listing, Appraising, and Assessing Discovered Property. – Subject to the provisions of subsection (c), above, and the presumptions established by subsection (f), below, discovered property shall be listed by the assessor in the name of the person required by G.S. 105-302 or G.S. 105-306. The discovery shall be deemed to be made on the date that the abstract is made or corrected pursuant to subsection (e) of this section. The assessor shall also make a tentative appraisal of the discovered property in accordance with the best information available to him.

When a discovery is made, the assessor shall mail a notice to the person in whose name the discovered property has been listed. The notice shall contain the following information:

- (1) The name and address of the person in whose name the property is listed;
- (2) A brief description of the property;
- (3) A tentative appraisal of the property;
- (4) A statement to the effect that the listing and appraisal will become final unless written exception thereto is filed with the assessor within 30 days from date of the notice.

Upon receipt of a timely exception to the notice of discovery, the assessor shall arrange a conference with the taxpayer to afford him the opportunity to present any evidence or argument he may have regarding the discovery. Within 15 days after the conference, the assessor shall give written notice to the taxpayer of his final decision. Written notice shall not be required, however, if the taxpayer signs an agreement accepting the listing and appraisal. In cases in which agreement is not reached, the taxpayer shall have 15 days from the date of the notice to request review of the decision of the assessor by the board of equalization and review or, if that board is not in session, by the board of commissioners. Unless the request for review by the county board is given at the conference, it shall be made in writing to the assessor. Upon receipt of a timely request for review, the provisions of G.S. 105-322 or G.S. 105-325, as appropriate, shall be followed.

(e) Record of Discovered Property. – When property is discovered, the taxpayer's original abstract (if one was submitted) may be corrected or a new abstract may be prepared to reflect the discovery. If a new abstract is prepared, it may be filed with the abstracts that were submitted during the regular listing period, or it may be filed separately with abstracts designated "Late Listings." Regardless of how filed, the listing shall have the same force and effect as if it had been submitted during the regular listing period.

(f) Presumptions. – When property is discovered and listed to a taxpayer in any year, it shall be presumed that it should have been listed by the same taxpayer for the preceding five years unless the taxpayer shall produce satisfactory evidence that the property was not in existence, that it was actually listed for taxation, or that it was not his duty to list the property during those years or some of them under the provisions of G.S. 105-302 and G.S. 105-306. If it is shown that the property should have been listed by some other taxpayer during some or all of the preceding years, the property shall be listed in the name of the appropriate taxpayer for the proper years, but the discovery shall still be deemed to have been made as of the date that the assessor first listed it.

(g) Taxation of Discovered Property. - When property is discovered, it shall be taxed for the year in which discovered and for any of the preceding five years during which it escaped taxation in accordance with the assessed value it should have been assigned in each of the years for which it is to be taxed and the rate of tax imposed in each such year. The penalties prescribed by subsection (h) of this section shall be computed and imposed regardless of the name in which the discovered property is listed. If the discovery is based upon an understatement of value, quantity, or other measurement rather than an omission from the tax list, the tax shall be computed on the additional valuation fixed upon the property, and the penalties prescribed by subsection (h) of this section shall be computed on the basis of the additional tax.

(h) Computation of Penalties. – Having computed each year's taxes separately as provided in subsection (g), above, there shall be added a penalty of ten percent (10%) of the amount of the tax for the earliest year in which the property was not listed, plus an additional ten percent (10%) of the same amount for each subsequent listing period that elapsed before the property was discovered. This penalty shall be computed separately for each year in which a failure to list occurred; and the year, the amount of the tax for that year, and the total of penalties for failure to list in that year shall be shown separately on the tax records; but the taxes and penalties for all years in which there was a failure to list shall be then totalled on a single tax receipt.

(h1) Repealed by Session Laws 1991, c. 624, s. 8.

(i) Collection. – For purposes of tax collection and foreclosure, the total figure obtained and recorded as provided in subsection (h) of this section shall be deemed to be a tax for the fiscal year beginning on July 1 of the calendar year in which the property was discovered. The schedule of discounts for prepayment and interest for late payment applicable to taxes for the fiscal year referred to in the preceding sentence shall apply when the total figure on the single tax receipt is paid. Notwithstanding the time limitations contained in G.S. 105-381, any property owner who is required to pay taxes on discovered property as herein provided shall be entitled to a refund of any taxes erroneously paid on the same property to other taxing jurisdictions in North Carolina. Claim for refund shall be filed in the county where such tax was erroneously paid as provided by G.S. 105-381.

(j) Tax Receipts Charged to Collector. - Tax receipts prepared as required by subsections (h) and (i) of this section for the taxes and penalties imposed upon discovered property shall be delivered to the tax collector, and he shall be charged with their collector. Such receipts shall have the same force and effect as if they had been delivered to the collector at the time of the delivery of the regular tax receipts for the current year, and the taxes charged in the receipts shall be a lien upon the property in accordance with the provisions of G.S. 105-355.

(k) Power to Compromise. – After a tax receipt computed and prepared as required by subsections (g) and (h) of this section has been delivered and charged to the tax collector as prescribed in subsection (j), above, the board of county commissioners, upon the petition of the

taxpayer, may compromise, settle, or adjust the county's claim for taxes arising therefrom. The board of commissioners may, by resolution, delegate the authority granted by this subsection to the board of equalization and review, including any board created by resolution pursuant to G.S. 105-322(a) and any special board established by local act.

Municipal Corporations. – The provisions of this section shall apply to all cities, (1)towns, and other municipal corporations having the power to tax property. Such governmental units shall designate an appropriate municipal officer to exercise the powers and duties assigned by this section to the assessor, and the powers and duties assigned to the board of county commissioners shall be exercised by the governing body of the unit. When the assessor discovers property having a taxable situs in a municipal corporation, he shall send a copy of the notice of discovery required by subsection (d) to the governing body of the municipality together with such other information as may be necessary to enable the municipality to proceed. The governing board of a municipality may, by resolution, delegate the power to compromise, settle, or adjust tax claims granted by this subsection and by subsection (k) of this section to the county board of equalization and review, including any board created by resolution pursuant to G.S. 105-322(a) and any special board established by local act.
