MINUTES HALIFAX COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS REGULAR MEETING DECEMBER 3, 2018

The Halifax County Board of Commissioners held a Regular Meeting on Monday, December 3, 2018, at 9:30 A. M. in the Historic Courthouse, Halifax, North Carolina.

Call to Order

Chairman Bryant called the meeting to order.

Adoption of the Agenda

Commissioner Johnson moved to approve the agenda as presented. Commissioner Brewer seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

Conflict of Interest

There was no conflict of interest noted by any member of the Board.

1. Consent Agenda

Commissioner Smith moved to approve the following items on the consent agenda. Commissioner Manning seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

A. Approval of Minutes

Andrea H. Wiggins, Clerk to the Board, requested that the Board approve the draft minutes of the May 21, 2018 Regular Meeting, June 4, 2018 Regular Meeting, June 18, 2018 Regular Meeting, and July 9, 2018 Regular Meeting.

B. Budget Amendments

Mary W. Duncan, Finance Director, requested that the Board approve a list of budget amendments, which is attached to these minutes as Attachment A.

C. Property Tax Releases - November 2018

Doris B. Hawkins, Halifax County Tax Coordinator and Collector, requested that the Board approve the property tax releases in accordance with N. C. G. S. §105-380 and N. C. G. S. §105-381.

D. 2019 Board of Commissioners Meeting Schedule.

Andrea H. Wiggins, Clerk to the Board, requested that the Board approve the 2019 Board of Commissioners Meeting Schedule.

E. Computers in Libraries Conference Scholarship

Ginny Orvedahl, Library Director, requested that the Board approve the submission of the Computers in Libraries Conference Scholarship application, the receipt of funds if awarded, and authorize the appropriate staff to execute the documents.

2. Public Comment Period N. C. G. S. §153A - 52.1

India King, 4108 Ridgecrest Road, Littleton, addressed the Board and requested that she not be required to pay the collection, disposal, and availability fees on her property as it had been unoccupied and not fit for human habitation. Chairman Bryant requested that the County Manager research this matter and respond to Ms. King by letter and also send a copy of the letter to the Board.

3. Agenda Items

A. Halifax County Stepping-Up Mental Health Program

Dr. Deron Coy, Correctional Behavioral Health, addressed the Board and provided a brief PowerPoint presentation regarding the Halifax County Stepping-Up Mental Health Program and the Halifax County Jail Pilot Program. The goals of the Stepping-Up Program were to assess the percentage of serious and persistently mentally ill in the jail, provide ongoing mental health treatment to detainees with an emphasis on the serious and persistently mentally ill, and explore alternative sentencing for the serious and persistently mentally ill. The ultimate goal was prebooking diversion for the serious and persistently mentally ill from the jail. From January to mid-November there were 173 individual mental health sessions held with 55 detainees. The booking and medical intake forms, medication records, available history and in-jail assessments indicated 10% to 15% of the jail population met the criteria for serious and persistently mentally ill, which consisted of psychotic disorders, bipolar disorder, and severe depression. Of the 55 detainees that were assessed, 47% were serious and persistently mentally ill, 20% were moderately to mildly depressed, 13% were primarily substance abuse, 11% had no diagnosis, and the remainder had intellectual limitations, antisocial based tendencies, or anxiety. Meeting the goals consisted of assessing the prevalence and provide initial and ongoing treatment within weeks of being online for videoconference, and establish alternative sentencing with the assistance of Mental Health Court through ongoing efforts with Brenda G. Branch, Chief District Court Judge, Visions Behavioral Health, and Cardinal Innovations.

B. Parks and Recreation Advisory Board Bylaws Amendments

Ian M. Bumgarner, Halifax County Parks and Recreation Advisory Board, addressed the Board and requested the approval of amendments to the bylaws as follows: Article II -Appointment and Composition of the Board, Section 1. The Advisory Board shall not exceed fifteen (15) ten (10) members that represent the diverse nature of Halifax County. Article III -Officers of the Board, Section 1. The Deputy County Manager, or his or her appointee, shall serve as Secretary to the Board and will have no vote. Section 2. Officers shall serve for one year from election with eligibility for re-election. Officers shall be elected each year, with eligibility for re-election in December and shall serve for one year beginning in January of the following year. Article IV - Duties of the Officers, Section 3. As the Secretary of the Board, the Deputy County Manager, or his or her appointee, may delegate all or part of the duties to another County Management staff member, but shall hold the office of the Secretary and shall be held responsible for the satisfactory accomplishment of the secretarial duties. Article VII - Meetings and Quorum, Section 2. In addition, special meetings shall be called upon written request by eight or more a majority of Board members. Article X - Communication with Board of Commissioners, Section 1. The Advisory Board may periodically will report biannually to the Board of Commissioners any updates regarding grants, projects, or other matters that may be of interest to the County Commissioners to keep them updated on the work of the Advisory Board.

Tony N. Brown, County Manager, recommended that the Board change biannually to annually similar to requirements of other boards/committees/commissions. It was the consensus of the Board to approve the recommendation of the County Manager.

Commissioner Manning recommended the following amendments for clarification as follows: Article III - Officers of the Board, Section 2. Officers shall serve for one year from election with eligibility for re election. Officers shall be elected each year in December and shall

serve for one year beginning in January of the following year, with eligibility for re-election. Article VII - Meetings and Quorum, Section 2. In addition, special meetings shall be called upon written request by eight or more a majority of total Board members. It was the consensus of the Board to approve the recommendations of Commissioner Manning.

Commissioner Brewer moved to approve the amendments to the bylaws of the Parks and Recreation Advisory Board. Commissioner Manning seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

C. C. D. Williams Construction Company, Inc.

C. Shane Lynch, Tax Assessor, addressed the Board stating that all businesses were required to list any business-related personal property and/or business-related improvements to leased real property during the annual listing period each year. When a business did not accurately list their personal property or list it at all, N. C. G. S. §105-312 allowed the Assessor to create a discovery bill for the current year and for any of the preceding five years during which it escaped taxation. The same statute allowed the Tax Assessor and Tax Collector to add a penalty of 10% of the amount of the tax for the earliest year in which the property was not listed, plus an additional 10% of the same amount for each subsequent listing period that elapsed before the property was discovered. The statute also provided the Board with the authority to compromise, settle, or adjust the taxes and penalty. The Board was provided letters from the accountant of C. D. Williams Construction Company, Inc., a breakdown of penalties, and a copy of N. C. G. S. §105-312 regarding discovered property, appraisal and penalty. He explained that the International Registration Plan listing was confusing to the Tax Department and other counties; however, it was the responsibility of the taxpayer to list all their property. It was requested that the Board decide whether to compromise, settle, or adjust the taxes and penalty in the total amount of \$2,706.54 regarding C. D. Williams Construction Company, Inc.

Charlie Williams, C. D. Williams Construction Company, Inc., requested that the Board waive the penalties based on the confusing rules of the International Registration Plan that no one could explain or understand including the Tax Department. He explained that all of his vehicles were registered with the Department of Motor Vehicles and that he listed the vehicles based on his understanding of the rules and was not trying to intentionally avoid paying taxes. Commissioner Qualls left the meeting.

Commissioner Smith moved to approve a compromise regarding C. D. Williams Construction Company, Inc., that a 10% penalty would be applied for each year from 2013 through 2018, which would reduce the penalty from \$2,704.54 to \$882.15 based upon the information Mr. Williams presented and the confusion regarding the International Registration Plan. Commissioner Manning seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

D. Health Department New Clinical Fees

Bruce Robistow, Health Department Director, addressed the Board requesting the approval of new clinical fees that were approved by the Board of Health during its November 26, 2018 Meeting as follows: Nexplanon Insertion \$107 and Nexplanon Removal \$107.

Commissioner Johnson moved to approve the Health Department new clinical fees. Commissioner Brewer seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

E. Roanoke Rapids Graded School District Lottery Funds Request

Mary W. Duncan, Finance Director, addressed the Board requesting the approval of the Roanoke Rapids Graded School District lottery funds request regarding the debt service on the Manning Elementary School in the amount of \$200,000.

Commissioner Brewer moved to approve the Roanoke Rapids Graded School District lottery funds request regarding the debt service on the Manning Elementary School in the amount of \$200,000. Commissioner Smith seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

4. **Board Appointments**

Health Board

Commissioner Johnson moved to reappoint Justin Blackmon, Donald Crowder, Eloise P. Hardee, Belinda Hill, Eric Nicholson, Kimberly Mack, Carol Anne Rupe, and Melissa Woodruff to serve on the Health Board, terms expiring December 31, 2021. Commissioner Brewer seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

Parks and Recreation Advisory Board

Commissioner Manning moved to appoint Hattie Staton to replace Loraine Searcy on the Parks and Recreation Advisory Board, term expiring September 30, 2021. Commissioner Johnson seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

5. Economic Development Report

Cathy A. Scott, Economic Development Director, addressed the Board and provided a brief PowerPoint presentation regarding the monthly Halifax County Economic Development Commission Activity Report.

6. County Manager's Report

Tony N. Brown, County Manager, addressed the Board and provided a copy of the North Carolina Tier Designations. He reminded the Board of the Retreat that was scheduled for Friday, December 7, 2018 at the Center for Energy Education at 9:00 A. M. and distributed an assignment to be completed in preparation of the meeting called Charting a Future Course.

7. <u>County Attorney's Report</u>

A. Offers to Purchase County Property - East 10th Street and Park Avenue, Roanoke Rapids

M. Glynn Rollins, Jr., County Attorney, addressed the Board stating that during the November 5, 2018 Regular Meeting, the Board received information regarding two offers to purchase certain County property in the Forest Hills Shopping Center, Roanoke Rapids. One offer was from Cynthia M. Fowler, Trustee under the Mildred V. Medlin Revocable Trust, to purchase a tract fronting 56 feet, more or less, on East 10th Street, running back 148 feet, more or less, for a price of \$1,500. The second offer was also from Cynthia M. Fowler for the purchase of a tract fronting 14 feet on Park Avenue, running back 140 feet, for a price of \$500. The Board authorized the sale of both tracts by the offer and upset bid process set forth in N. C. G. S. §160A-269 after which both tracts were advertised for upset bids and no upset bids were received; therefore, the Board must decide whether to accept the two offers. It was requested that if the Board desired to accept either offer, the resolutions must be adopted, which are attached to these minutes as Attachment B.

Commissioner Manning moved to adopt the resolution to accept the offer for the purchase of County property being sold by negotiated offer and upset bid process pursuant to N. C. G. S. §160A-269 regarding Forest Hills Shopping Center, Park Avenue Tract, and the resolution to accept the offer for the purchase of County property being sold by negotiated offer and upset bid process pursuant to N. C. G. S. §160A-269 regarding Forest Hills Shopping Center, East 10th Street Tract. Commissioners Brewer seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

B. North Carolina Department of Transportation Offer to Purchase Property.

M. Glynn Rollins, Jr., County Attorney, addressed the Board stating that on November 13, 2018, the County received an offer from the North Carolina Department of Transportation to purchase the necessary right-of-way area located at EMS Station 6 at the corner of Highway 125 and American Legion Road. The offer was in the amount of \$39,725 and was accompanied by an appraisal. On November 27, 2018, County staff made a counter offer of \$50,000 and required the installation of bollards at the southeast corner of the EMS Station and around the emergency generator on the south side of the building. On November 30, 2018, the North Carolina Department of Transportation agent informed the County that they would be willing to pay \$52,000 for the right-of-way, but would prefer that the County install the bollards, hence the additional \$2,000.

Commissioner Brewer moved to approve the North Carolina Department of Transportation offer to purchase the right away area located at EMS Station 6 in the amount of \$52,000 and to authorize the appropriate staff to execute the documents. Commissioner Manning seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

8. Other Business

Commissioner Johnson reminded the Board that during the November 19, 2018 Regular Meeting she requested a copy of the Sheriff's Annual Report, which had not been received. Chairman Bryant requested that the Clerk to the Board contact the Sheriff regarding this matter and provide copies to the Board.

9. <u>Closed Session</u>

A. Approval of Closed Session Minutes

Commissioner Manning moved to approve the June 18, 2018 and July 9, 2018 Closed Session minutes that would remain sealed until allowed to be released. Commissioner Johnson seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

10. Announcement - Halifax County Schools Annual Luncheon

The Board left the Historic Courthouse at approximately 12:00 Noon to attend the Halifax County Schools Annual Luncheon.

11. Adjourn until December 7, 2018 Retreat

With there being no further matters to come before the Board, Commissioner Smith moved to adjourn the meeting until December 7, 2018 Retreat at 9:00 A. M. at the Center for Energy Education. Commissioner Brewer seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

RESOLUTION TO ACCEPT OFFER FOR PURCHASE OF COUNTY PROPERTY BEING SOLD BY NEGOTIATED OFFER AND UPSET BID PROCESS PURSUANT TO G. S. 160A-269

(Forest Hills Shopping Center - Park Avenue Tract)

WHEREAS, Halifax County (County) owns certain real property in the City of Roanoke Rapids, Halifax County, North Carolina, generally described as the parking lot and access drives for Forest Hills Shopping Center; and

WHEREAS, G S. 160A-269 permits the County to sell property by upset bid, after receipt of an offer for the property; and

WHEREAS, on or about October 23, 2018, the County received an offer from Cynthia M. Fowler to purchase a portion the property for the amount of \$500.00, accompanied by the required 5% deposit, said portion of property being described as follows:

That certain tract or parcel of land lying and being situate in the City of Roanoke Rapids, Halifax County, North Carolina, and being more particularly described as follows: BEGINNING at a point on the northwestern edge of the right of way for Park Avenue, said point being the southernmost corner of property now owned by Cynthia Medlin Fowler (see deed recorded in Book 2513, Page 580, Halifax Public Registry, Tract Two); thence from said point of beginning and along the southwestern boundary line of said Fowler property North 33 degrees, 01 minutes West 140 feet, more or less, to a point at the westernmost corner of said Fowler property; thence turning along a new line South 56 degrees, 57 minutes West 14 feet to a new point, the westernmost corner of the property described herein; thence turning along a new line South 33 degrees, 01 minutes East (intended to be parallel with the aforesaid southwestern boundary line of the Fowler property) 140 feet to a new point on the northwestern edge of the right of way for Park Avenue; thence turning along a new line along the northwestern edge of the right of way for Park Avenue, North 56 degrees, 57 minutes East 14 feet to the point of beginning (the "Property"); and

WHEREAS, on November 5, 2018, after considering the offer to purchase from Fowler, the Board of Commissioners authorized the sale of the Property by upset bid pursuant to G.S. 160A-269; and

WHEREAS, on November 26, 2018, after advertisement as required by law, no upset bids were received and the aforementioned offer from Fowler dated October 23, 2018, was the only qualified bid received on the Property;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the offer of \$500.00 made by Cynthia M. Fowler, be and hereby is accepted, and the Chairman of the Halifax County Board of Commissioners and appropriate county staff are hereby authorized to execute such instruments as may be needed to effect the sale of the Property under the following terms and conditions:

1. The buyer must pay with cash or certified funds at closing.

- 2. In addition to the purchase price, the buyer must reimburse the County for all advertising costs incurred throughout the upset bid process.
 - 3. The County will bear no closing or other cost in connection with the sale.
- 4. Conveyance of the Property will be by special warranty deed, subject to all defects in title when the Property was acquired by the County.
- 5. Notwithstanding the legal description above, the legal description on the instrument of conveyance will be prepared from or referenced to a survey to be provided by the buyer, approved by the City of Roanoke Rapids planning office, and recorded in the Halifax County Register of Deeds Office.
- 6. As the Property was acquired by tax foreclosure, the proceeds of sale will be distributed in the manner required under G.S. 105-376.

Fowler, Trustee, be and hereby is accepted, and the Chairman of the Halifax County Board of Commissioners and appropriate county staff are hereby authorized to execute such instruments as may be needed to effect the sale of the Property under the following terms and conditions:

- 1. The buyer must pay with cash or certified funds at closing.
- 2. In addition to the purchase price, the buyer must reimburse the County for all advertising costs incurred throughout the upset bid process.
 - 3. The County will bear no closing or other cost in connection with the sale.
- 4. Conveyance of the Property will be by special warranty deed, subject to all defects in title when the Property was acquired by the County.
- 5. Notwithstanding the legal description above, the legal description on the instrument of conveyance will be prepared from or referenced to a survey to be provided by the buyer, approved by the City of Roanoke Rapids planning office, and recorded in the Halifax County Register of Deeds Office.

Call to Order

Chairman Bryant called the meeting to order.

Invocation and Pledge of Allegiance

Commissioner Manning provided the invocation and the Pledge of Allegiance was then recited.

Adoption of the Agenda

Commissioner Brewer moved to approve the agenda as presented. Commissioner Qualls seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

Conflict of Interest

There was no conflict of interest noted by any member of the Board.

1. Opening - 2018 Accomplishments

Tony N. Brown, County Manager, addressed the Board and welcomed everyone present. He then reviewed the 2018 Accomplishments that had been provided for the Board's review and discussion.

2. Charting a Future Course

Neil Emory, North Carolina Association of County Commissioners, Facilitator, addressed the Board and conducted a brief exercise entitled Charting a Future Course in regards to long-term and short-term goals. In preparation for the Retreat, the Commissioners were asked to provide two major goals that the County would be faced with, propose an action plan on how to facilitate strategic planning, and provide the cost associated with the goals.

Commissioner Bryant stated that his first goal was regarding the opening and full operation of Klausner Lumber Two. A brief discussion was held regarding the continued delays and the importance of Klausner Lumber Two opening, being fully operational, and providing jobs in the County. The second goal was the renovation or replacement of a new Weldon Stem High School Career Academies. A brief discussion was held regarding a plan for improving the high school, average daily membership, strategic planning, financing, use of lottery funds, building a prototype school, and taking into consideration the needs of the students attending Weldon Stem High School Career Academies and the request of Weldon City Schools Board of Education.

Commissioner Brewer stated that her first goal was regarding mental health and social security. A brief discussion was held regarding a declining and aging population and its impact on services the County provided, inclining young adults to relocate to the County and raise a family, lack of employment opportunities, untrained workforce and the need for workforce development, and if the Board was not in favor of raising taxes how would the County meet the need for required health and social services. The second goal was regarding broadband. A discussion was held regarding establishing broadband across the entire County to assist children with their educational needs and for all North Carolina counties to press upon the General Assembly the need for broadband distribution, especially in rural areas.

Commissioner Johnson stated that her first goal was improving education. A brief discussion was held regarding improving education by ensuring that the academic requirements were met by each school that would enable all students to excel educationally and to be able to compete globally. The second goal was regarding broadband. A brief discussion was held in regards to the accessibility of broadband in the entire County, the educational impact on students,

and how local governments could band together in addressing the General Assembly regarding the need for broadband.

Commissioner Qualls stated that his first goal was to improve water quality. A brief discussion was held regarding futile efforts to improve water quality by partnering with the Town of Weldon to build a new water plant, and that the County had made some improvements; however, further improvements were needed to the improve water quality. The second goal was regarding the tremendous needs of the County. A brief discussion was held regarding financing the cost of a jail expansion due to the overpopulation of inmates; a new Weldon Stem High School Career Academies, capital projects, funding programs that were mandated and not funding the programs that were not mandated; severe inequity in employee compensation; and the need to facilitate better education and providing equitable structure, mentoring, and support for all students, especially for the students that do not have the resources and support at home. A discussion was held regarding raising taxes for a poor County and the need to be more prudent regarding spending.

Commissioner Smith stated that his first goal was the Jail expansion. A brief discussion was held regarding when the Board would address the needs of the jail concerning the overpopulation of inmates, cost of transporting and housing inmates in other localities, administrative code violations, and the cost of financing a new jail expansion. The second goal was how to retain trained employees from leaving due to higher salaries in neighboring localities, how to recruit and retain the younger population, and to provide safe constructive recreation and vocational training for youth in the County.

Commissioner Manning stated that his first goal was to improve employee customer service and communication skills. A brief discussion was held regarding the level of customer service that County departments were providing to the public when answering telephone calls. It was requested that the County Manager have a discussion during the next Department Head Meeting and direct staff to state their name when answering telephone calls so that the public would know with whom they were communicating. The second goal was funding needs and not wants and collecting and accounting for all County funds. A brief discussion was held regarding making sure that all property was properly listed and billed.

Chairman Bryant provided the blessing and the Board recessed for lunch.

3. Charting a Future Course Continued

Mr. Emory reviewed the submission from the Management Team in regards to long-term and short-term goals as follows: 1. Employee total compensation which included a pay study, employee pay to include cost of living allowance and performance pay, health savings account funds, and 401K contribution. 2. Capital Improvement Plan/Capital Reserve Fund. 3. County rebranding and vision which included moving into the 21st century, taking advantage of County resources, and charting a bigger and brighter future for the County. 4. Technology/Broadband included providing access to citizens. 5. Education funding which included the selling of surplus property, money towards school capital improvements with the County being one of the lowest per pupil spending in North Carolina. A discussion was held regarding the different types

of strategic planning and reserving funds for building schools, jails, and other future infrastructure needs; employee training; employee compensation; making sure employees had what was needed to do a great job for the County; and partnering with the Halifax Community College regarding workforce investments.

Mr. Emory expressed how important it was to recognize issues and what could be done to begin moving forward with a strategic plan, capital improvement plan, capital reserve fund, surveying employees regarding what could be done better, and contacting the college regarding workforce investments and training. It was recommended that the Board have discussions and provide direction regarding strategic planning and facilitate groups moving forward.

4. Halifax County Boards and Commissions

Tony N. Brown, County Manager, addressed the Board and inquired if there was anyone that wanted to serve on a different board or commission that had a commissioner appointment. He provided a list of the Halifax County Boards and Commissions. Mr. Emory stated that there were boards and commissions that were not currently meeting or was being recommended to be dissolved such as the Grievance Committee, EMS Advisory Committee, Halifax County Human Relations Commission, and Solid Waste Advisory Board. After a brief discussion was held, it was requested that the County Manager place this matter on an upcoming agenda and provide background information along with explanations regarding why the highlighted boards and commissions should be dissolved based on whether they were active or inactive, mandated by statute, and those that had difficulties meeting due to the lack of a quorum. Commissioner Brewer left the meeting.

5. Halifax County Budget

Mary W. Duncan, Finance Director, addressed the Board and provided an update regarding the history of Fund Balance for the years 2004-2018. The unaudited total Fund Balance was in the amount of \$31,097,877; 50.88% and the unassigned Fund Balance was in the amount of \$12,472,502; 20.41%. She then reviewed the FY 2018-2019 General Fund Debt Payment Schedule and FY 2019 Revenue Projection.

Dia H. Denton, Deputy County Manager, addressed the Board and reviewed the 2019-2020 Departmental Capital Outlay which consisted of total new and recurring capital as follows: County Funds \$2,759,353; Public Utilities \$354,800; and Tax Revaluation \$8,000.

M. Glynn Rollins, Jr., County Attorney, addressed the Board and provided a list of county owned property that was currently not being used for review. He requested that the Board consider implementing a capital reserve fund that would list the names of the projects and assist the Board in planning how to fund the projects over the next five to ten years and would be utilized in conjunction with the capital improvement plan. It was the consensus of the Board to authorize that the County Attorney provide examples of funding mechanisms.

Tony N. Brown, County Manager, stated that each year the Board needed to determine whether to change its method of distribution of local sales and use taxes from the ad valorem

method to the per capita method. It was the consensus of the Board to continue with the ad valorem method of distribution.

Renee Perry, Human Resources Management Director, addressed the Board and provided a brief report regarding the total compensation of the County. It was requested that the Board consider a County contribution for a 401K match from 1% to 5% for eligible employees, approve and implement a pay study, and a 5% cost of living increase. It was the consensus of the Board that the County Manager would provide the cost of a pay study. After a brief discussion was held, Commissioner Manning suggested that the County Manager include a 2%, 3%, 4%, and 5% cost of living increase in the budget for consideration. Commissioner Qualls suggested that the County Manager use the same process that was used during the last budget work session in which employee compensation was already included in the budget.

6. Adjourn until January 7, 2019 Regular Meeting at 9:30 A.M.

With there being no further matters to come before the Board, Commissioner Smith moved to adjourn the meeting until the January 7, 2019 Regular Meeting. Commissioner Manning seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

Sheriff S. Wes Tripp, Sheriff's Office, requested that the Board approve the receipt of a donation from James Allen for a K9 vest in the amount of \$732.15

C. Property Tax Releases - December 2018

Doris B. Hawkins, Halifax County Tax Coordinator and Collector, requested that the Board approve the property tax releases in accordance with G. S. §105-380 and G. S. §105-381.

2. **Special Recognitions**

A. Retirement Resolution - Reaver R. Gay, Department of Social Services

Commissioner Manning read and presented a retirement resolution to Reaver R. Gay, Department of Social Services, which is attached to these minutes as Attachment B.

Commissioner Manning moved to adopt the retirement resolution honoring Reaver R. Gay, Department of Social Services. Commissioner Smith seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

B. Retirement Resolution - Lawrence R. Langley, Operations Department

Commissioner Brewer read and presented a retirement resolution to Lawrence R. Langley, Operations Department, which is attached to these minutes as Attachment C.

Commissioner Brewer moved to adopt the retirement resolution honoring Lawrence R. Langley, Operations Department. Commissioner Manning seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

3. Public Comment Period N. C. G. S. §153A - 52.1

Paul W. Heaton, Jr., 309 Long Circle, Roanoke Rapids, addressed the Board and expressed concerns regarding hunting deer with dogs in the County and the trespassing of dogs on his private property. He explained that he was not against regulating weapons and hunting; however, was requesting that the Board develop some form of regulation that law enforcement could enforce regarding the trespassing of hunting dogs on private property.

David A. Box, 83 Berkshire Drive, Littleton, addressed the Board and echoed the concerns of Mr. Heaton regarding hunting dogs trespassing on private property. He explained that he was not against dog hunting; however, expressed concerns regarding the lack of respect exhibited by the hunters and their dogs trespassing on private property. He requested that the Board adopt regulations that would protect the private property of landowners.

4. Agenda Items

A. City of Roanoke Rapids One Cent Local Option Sales and Use Tax

Emery G. Doughtie, City of Roanoke Rapids Mayor, addressed the Board and stated that on December 18, 2018, the Roanoke Rapids City Council adopted a resolution to pursue local legislation that would authorize a one cent local option sales and use tax referendum, which would sunset when the Roanoke Rapids Theatre loan was completely paid. The primary need of the City was to offset the renegotiated loan payments on the Roanoke Rapids Theatre, which was approximately \$980,000 per year. The City of Roanoke Rapids had been frugal in its spending and had not raised property taxes in over 12 years or sales and use taxes in 16 years. The additional revenue would generate approximately \$1 Million in revenue and improve the quality of life for its citizens by meeting the critical budgetary needs of the City. It was requested that the Board approve a letter of support regarding the efforts of the City of Roanoke Rapids to obtain a one cent local option sales and use tax in the City of Roanoke Rapids.

Commissioner Qualls moved to authorize the County staff to draft a letter of support that states that the County supported the concept of the City of Roanoke Rapids to obtain a one cent local option sales and use tax in the City of Roanoke Rapids. Commissioner Manning seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

B. 2018 Audit Report

James Bence, Mauldin and Jenkins, LLC, addressed the Board and provide a brief PowerPoint presentation regarding the 2018 Audit Report. The audit was performed in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and government auditing standards. The County received an unmodified clean opinion on basic financial statements and full cooperation was received from management and staff during the audit. The General Fund revenues were 1.8% less than the amended budgeted amount. Expenditures for many functional areas were less than budgeted by \$8.4 Million, 12.8%, from the operating budget. Human services was \$4.5 Million under budget and general government function was \$2.1 Million under budget. Several departments were under budget due to personnel vacancies and efforts to spend conservatively. Other financing sources included proceeds from the sale of capital assets as well as the issuance of a new EMS equipment lease. The budgeted use of Fund Balance was not needed to the extent anticipated, as actual revenues and other financing sources exceeded expenditures. The Water and Sewer Fund had an increase in net position in the amount of \$22,000 for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2018 and the Solid Waste Landfill had a decrease in the amount of \$267,000 to net position for the same period; however, both funds had a positive net position at the end of the year. The full 2018 Audit Report can be obtained by contacting the Finance Director.

Commissioner Manning moved to accept the 2018 Audit Report. Commissioner Brewer seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

C. Register of Deeds Report

Christie C. Avens, Register of Deeds, addressed the Board and provided the annual Register of Deeds Report. The FY 2017-2018 revenue totals in the amount of \$538,359.50 was generated from five different sources as follows: vital records \$66,790; recording fees \$147,940; excise stamp fees \$298,709; marriage licenses \$15,660; miscellaneous revenues \$8,934.50; and refunds \$326. A major goal of the Register of Deeds was the expansion of available online real estate records from 1905 through 1933 that would be completed in two phases. Phase one had been completed which consisted of scanning the indexes and phase two consisted of scanning the hard copy deed books that referenced the same date range as the indexes. Kofile Preservation had completely restored six older deed books and would continue to restore other deed books that needed repair. The Register of Deeds Office continued to participate in the statewide birth certificate issuance program that was offered by the North Carolina Vital Records. It was noted that 159 birth certificates were issued from outside the County, which was convenient to citizens and enhanced customer service.

Commissioner Smith moved to accept the Register of Deeds Report. Commissioner Brewer seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

D. North Carolina 911 Grant Update

Heather Joyner, E-911 Central Communications Manager, addressed the Board and reported that the North Carolina 911 Board Grant Committee completed a reconsideration review of the North Carolina 911 Grant application for the Halifax County 911 Regional Backup Center in the amount of \$8,500,000, which was approximately 98% of the estimated project cost. On December 7, 2018, the North Carolina 911 Board Grant Committee made a recommendation to the North Carolina 911 Board for 50% of the grant toward building a new Central

Communications 911 Center in the amount of \$4,067,779.98 that would also serve as a backup center for Warren and Franklin counties. The grant award was conditioned upon a written response to questions the Board needed to answer no later than January 8, 2019, before the grant agreement would be drafted and signed. The questions were as follows: Is Halifax County willing to accept the reduced amount of funds in the amount of \$4,067,779.98? Will the project be completed as described in the grant application with the awarded grant funds? Explain any changes either in funds or scope that may be associated with the grant award amount. It was requested that the Board approve the receipt of funds in the amount of \$4,067,779.98 and staff would continue to pursue additional grant funds as well as no/low-interest loans to support the project; decide whether the project would be completed as described in the grant application with the awarded grant funds; and explain any changes either in funds or scope that may be associated with the grant award amount.

Commissioner Smith moved to approve the receipt of North Carolina 911 Grant funds in the amount of \$4,067,779.98 and to authorize staff to draft a letter of acceptance with the understanding that the Board would have to do its due diligence regarding finding additional funding, and if the funds could not be obtained the County would not be able to move forward with the project. Commissioner Qualls seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

5. **Board Appointments**

Grievance Committee

Commissioner Qualls moved to reappoint Tony Brown, Frederick Bunch, and Kristen Scott to serve on the Grievance Committee, terms expiring January 31, 2021. Commissioner Brewer seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

Commissioner Manning moved to waive the term limits and reappoint Ed Johnson and Ginny Orvedahl to serve on the Grievance Committee, terms expiring January 31, 2021. Commissioner Qualls seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

Halifax - Northampton Regional Airport Authority

Commissioner Qualls moved to reappoint Vernon J. Bryant and Edward Lee Clements to serve on the Halifax - Northampton Regional Airport Authority, terms expiring January 31, 2022. Commissioner Smith seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

Commissioner Qualls moved to waive the term limit and reappoint Julia Meacham to serve on the Halifax - Northampton Regional Airport Authority, terms expiring January 31, 2022. Commissioner Brewer seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

Industrial Facilities and Pollution Control

It was the consensus of the Board to defer action on the Industrial Facilities and Pollution Control until the next meeting.

Juvenile Crime Prevention Council

Commissioner Smith moved to reappoint Valerie Asbell, Terry Buffaloe, Eric Cunningham, Chuck Hasty, Robin Johnson, Teresa King, Sonynia Leonard, Angela Moody, and Barbara Plum to serve on the Juvenile Crime Prevention Council, terms expiring January 31, 2021. Commissioner Qualls seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

Commissioner Smith moved to waive the term limits and reappoint Brenda Branch, Tony Brown, Doris Mack, and Marcelle Smith to serve on the Juvenile Crime Prevention Council, terms expiring January 31, 2021. Commissioner Manning seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

Economic Development Report

Cathy A. Scott, Economic Development Director, addressed the Board and provided a brief PowerPoint presentation regarding the monthly Halifax County Economic Development Commission Activity Report.

8. County Attorney's Report

A. North Carolina Department of Transportation Request - Right of Way at EMS Station 6

M. Glynn Rollins, Jr., County Attorney, addressed the Board stating that during the December 3, 2018 Regular Meeting, the Board approved granting a right of way and easement to the North Carolina Department of Transportation related to the improvements on Highway 125. Following that action, the North Carolina Department of Transportation representatives sent paperwork for execution by the County. After reviewing the paperwork, it was discovered that the North Carolina Department of Transportation was expecting to purchase fee simple title for the 0.074 acre right of way area; however, it was assumed that the request was for the right of way. There was no practical difference in conveying the right of way in fee simple title since the 0.074 acre of land would always be used as a highway. Call to Order

Chairman Bryant called the meeting to order.

Invocation and Pledge of Allegiance

Commissioner Smith provided the invocation and the Pledge of Allegiance was then recited.

Adoption of the Agenda

Commissioner Brewer moved to adopt the agenda as presented. Commissioner Smith

seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

Conflict of Interest

Commissioner Manning stated that he may have a perceived conflict of interest regarding Item 1A. FY 2019-2020 Halifax Home Health and Hospice Budget - Board of Health Funding Request as his wife received very good services from Halifax Home Health and Hospice. There was no conflict of interest noted by any other member of the Board.

1. Agenda Items

A. FY 2019-2020 Halifax Home Health and Hospice Budget - Board of Health Funding Request

Bruce Robistow, Health Director, addressed the Board and provided a brief history regarding Halifax Home Health and Hospice. It was reported that Halifax Home Health and Hospice had been in operation since 1969 and was very profitable due to being the primary sole provider for the County and surrounding counties. In the early 2000s, home health and hospice reimbursements began to see a significant change and at the same time private companies began operations and provided care to top payors only and attracted County staff with higher salaries. Halifax Home Health and Hospice became the primary provider for the uninsured and underinsured which reduced revenue. In 2010, a consultant was hired to provide an operational assessment which recommended the sale of hospice and to improve operations in home health. During that time, this recommendation was presented to the Commissioners and was not approved. In 2016, it was obvious that Fund Balance could not sustain losses; therefore, another assessment was completed. In 2018, the Fund Balance depleted and an assessment with return on investment was completed. The results and action plan were then presented to the Board of Health which consisted of the following acknowledgements: The importance of service for the public health of the County; the need to be self-sustaining moving forward to provide service; previous assessments were not acted on; and the inability to provide a budget for FY 2019-2020 with existing finances. The Board of Health unanimously voted to request funds in the amount of \$300,000 from the County that would provide an opportunity for Home Health and Hospice to implement the assessment recommendations.

Tammy Rodwell, Halifax Home Health and Hospice, provided a brief review of the common findings as follows: The recruitment of staff and emphasizing County benefits. Marketing the services offered by visiting hospitals, nursing homes, doctor offices, and improving the 2.5 star rating. Outsource billing and contract with more insurance carriers. Decrease cost for contracted therapy services. Improve the reimbursement case mix weight and good referrals. The total estimated return on investment upon the effective adoption of the findings was in the amount of \$228,000 plus the increase referral capture rate in the amount of \$150,000 in revenue resulted in a total with minimal improvement in the amount of \$378,000. The steps that had begun to improve revenues included the following: hired three part-time nurses and one part-time social worker, utilizing patient portal at UNC, utilizing diverse advertising with Jo Storey and Halifax Regional Medical Center, outsource billing with addendum pending for Barnestorm to begin the billing of all payers, investigating and

establishing a County position for physical therapy and seeking an alternative agency to contract, utilizing software to improve documenting records correctly and maximizing reimbursement, and initiated contract with United Healthcare in network for hospice services and awaiting contract with Humana and Aetna. A comparison of revenue and expense summary for December 2018 and December 2017 were reviewed as follows: December 2018 Home Health revenues \$387,162; expenses \$510,569 and difference (\$123,407) and Hospice revenues \$169,561, expenses \$156,724, and difference \$12,837. The total December 2018 revenues \$556,723; expenses \$667,293; difference (\$110,570) and Fund Balance to balance budget \$277,301. December 2017 Home Health revenues \$398,992; expenses \$536,237 and difference (\$137,245) and Hospice revenues \$157,019, expenses \$161,266, and difference (\$4,247). The total December 2017 revenues \$556,011; expenses \$697,503; difference \$141,492 and Fund Balance to balance budget \$353,923.

Mr. Robistow requested that the Board of Commissioners approve the request to implement the consultant recommendations and assist Halifax Home Health and Hospice with operational costs in the amount of \$300,000 for FY 2019-2020, which was approved by the Board of Health at its November 26, 2018 meeting.

After an in-depth discussion was held, Commissioner Manning moved to approve the Board of Health's request to appropriate funds in the amount of \$300,000 for the FY 2019-2020 Halifax Home Health and Hospice Budget and to charge the Health Director with providing the Board of Commissioners with a monthly financial report. Commissioner Smith seconded the motion.

B. 2019 Halifax County Recreation Partners Program

Ian M. Bumgarner, Sr. Management Analyst, addressed the Board and inquired whether the maximum award amount per applicant should be increased for the 2019 Halifax County Recreation Partners Program, as the total amount budgeted was \$35,000. Currently, the maximum award was in the amount of \$2,000 per applicant; however, in prior years the maximum amount awarded was in the amount of \$3,000 per applicant. An update was provided regarding the 2018 Halifax County Recreation Partners Program as only three of the ten recipients that were awarded funds had submitted reports regarding how the funds were utilized in accordance with the grant agreements.

It was recommended that a letter reminding the applicants that received funds during the 2018 Halifax County Recreation Partners Program that their report had not been received and if not received by a certain date their recreation program would not be eligible for future funding.

Commissioner Smith moved to approve that the maximum award per applicant would remain in the amount of \$2,000 for the 2019 Halifax County Recreation Partners Program and if funding was still available that a request be made regarding the remaining funds. Commissioner Johnson seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

C. Budget Amendments

Mary W. Duncan, Finance Director, requested that the Board approve a list of budget amendments, which is attached to these minutes as Attachment A.

Commissioner Qualls moved to approve the budget amendments. Commissioner Johnson seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

Ms. Duncan reviewed and presented an additional budget amendment regarding the final Halifax County Audit expenses to transfer funds in the amount of \$21,740 from the Contingency Fund to the Audit line, which is attached to these minutes as Attachment B.

Commissioner Qualls moved to approve the additional budget amendment regarding the final Halifax County Audit expenses to transfer funds in the amount of \$21,740 from the Contingency Fund to the Audit line. Commissioner Johnson seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

2. Other Business

A. Juvenile Crime Prevention Council Allocation Expansion Resolution

Marcelle O. Smith, Juvenile Crime Prevention Council Chairman, requested that the Board adopt the Juvenile Crime Prevention Council Allocation Expansion Resolution that would fully support an adequate and timely increase of local Juvenile Crime Prevention funding to ensure program expansion and successful implementation of the Juvenile Justice Reinvestment Act Raise the Age Legislation, set for December 1, 2019, which is attached to these minutes as Attachment C.

Commissioner Smith moved to adopt the Juvenile Prevention Council Allocation Expansion Resolution. Commissioner Qualls seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

B. Ash Monofill and Area 1 C&D Landfill Closure Projects

M. Glynn Rollins, Jr., County Attorney, addressed the Board and requested the approval of a letter to Mark Short, Project Engineer for Glover Construction Company, Inc., regarding their request for a temporary suspension of work due to weather and poor soil conditions in

regards to the Halifax County Landfill Facility, Ash Monofill and Area 1 C&D Landfill Closures, which was provided for the Board's review.

Commissioner Manning moved to authorize the Chairman to execute a letter to Mark Short, Project Engineer for Glover Construction Company, Inc., regarding their request for a temporary suspension of work due to weather and poor soil conditions in regards to the Halifax County Landfill Facility, Ash Monofill and Area 1 C&D Landfill Closures. Commissioner Brewer seconded the motion, which passed unanimously by voice vote.

C. Charters of Freedom Project

Commissioner Manning provided a brief update regarding the Charters of Freedom Project. A diagram of the Charters of Freedom Project which consisted of the Declaration of Independence, United States Constitution, and the Bill of Rights along with the addition of the Halifax Resolves was provided for the Board's review and it was recommended that the structures be located in front of the Old Commissioners Building. There was no cost associated with the Charters of Freedom structure; however, the cost of the Halifax Resolves structure would be approximately \$8,000, which would be paid by fundraising efforts. It was requested that the Board approve that the Charters of Freedom and Halifax Resolves be located in front of the Old Commissioners Building and to move forward with the project.

Ken Wilson, Charters of Freedom Champion, stated that he would be meeting with David W. Streater, State Director of the Foundation Forward, Inc., and their construction foreman on January 29, 2019 to survey the site recommended for the project. He further stated that firm commitments had been received in the amount of \$2,000 through fundraising efforts. All funds would be sent to Mr. Streater to be deposited into a bank account and any funds over and above the project cost would remain with the Charters of Freedom Project to assist with their next project. The dedication ceremony was scheduled to be held on Halifax Resolves Day, April 12, 2019 at 2:00 P. M.

There was no Closed Session matter for discussion.

4. Adjourn until the February 4, 2019 Regular Meeting

WHEREAS, JCPC funding has seen no increase in more than nine years; and,

WHEREAS, the effort to immediately and effectively address juvenile offending behavior is an evidence-based investment in North Carolina's future; and,

WHEREAS, effective intervention and programming reduces detention and youth development commitments as a cost savings to the state and county;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that Halifax County fully supports an adequate and timely increase of local Juvenile Crime Prevention funding to ensure program expansion and successful implementation of the Juvenile Justice Reinvestment Act Raise the Age Legislation, set for December 1, 2019.

Attachment A General Terms and Conditions

DEFINITIONS

Unless indicated otherwise from the context, the following terms shall have the following meanings in this Contract. Some definitions are from 9 NCAC 3M.0102 unless otherwise noted. If the rule or statute that is the source of the definition is changed by the adopting authority, the change shall be incorporated herein.

- (1) "Recipient" (as used in the context of the definitions below) shall mean and include every public office, public officer or official (State or local, elected or appointed), institution, board, commission, bureau, council, department, authority or other unit of government of the State or of any county, unit, special district or other political sub agency of government. For other purposes in this Contract, "Recipient" shall mean the entity identified as one of the parties hereto.
- (2) "Audit" means an examination of records or financial accounts to verify their accuracy.
- (3) "Certification of Compliance" means a report provided by the Recipient to the Office of the State Auditor that states that the Subrecipient has met the reporting requirements established by this Subchapter and included a statement of certification by the Recipient and copies of the submitted Subrecipient reporting package.
- (4) "Compliance Supplement" refers to the North Carolina State Compliance Supplement, maintained by the State and Local Government Finance Agency within the North Carolina Department of State Treasurer that has been developed in cooperation with agencies to assist the local auditor in identifying program compliance requirements and audit procedures for testing those requirements.
- (5) "Contract" means a legal instrument that is used to reflect a relationship between the Recipient, Subrecipient, and subrecipient.
- (6) "Fiscal Year" means the annual operating year of the non-State entity.
- "Financial Assistance" means assistance that (7) non-State entities receive or administer in the form of grants, loans, loan guarantees, property (including donated surplus property), cooperative agreements, interest subsidies, insurance, food commodities, appropriations, and other assistance. Financial assistance does not include amounts received as reimbursement for services rendered to individuals for Medicare and Medicaid patient services.

- (8) "Financial Statement" means a report providing financial statistics relative to a given part of an organization's operations or status.
- (9) "Grant" means financial assistance provided by an Recipient, Subrecipient, or subrecipient to carry out activities whereby the grantor anticipates no programmatic involvement with the Subrecipient or subrecipient during the performance of the grant.
- (10) "Subrecipient" has the meaning in NCGS 143C-6-23(a)(2): a non-State entity that receives a grant of State funds from a State agency, department, or institution but does not include any non-State entity subject to the audit and other reporting requirements of the Local Government Commission. For other purposes in this Contract, "Subrecipient" shall mean the entity identified as one of the parties hereto.
- (11) "Grantor" means an entity that provides resources, generally financial, to another entity in order to achieve a specified goal or objective.
- (12) "Non-State Entity" has the meaning in NCGS 143C-1-1(d)(18): Any of the following that is not a State agency: An individual, a firm, a partnership, an association, a county, a corporation, or any other organization acting as a unit. The term includes a unit of local government and public authority.
- (13) "Public Authority" has the meaning in NCGS 143C-1-1(d)(22): A municipal corporation that is not a unit of local government or a local governmental authority, board, commission, council, or agency that (i) is not a municipal corporation and (ii) operates on an area, regional, or multiunit basis, and the budgeting and accounting systems of which are not fully a part of the budgeting and accounting systems of a unit of local government.
- (14) "Single Audit" means an audit that includes an examination of an organization's financial statements, internal controls, and compliance with the requirements of Federal or State awards.
- (15) "Special Appropriation" means a legislative act authorizing the expenditure of a designated amount of public funds for a specific purpose.
- (16) "State Funds" means any funds appropriated by the North Carolina General Assembly or collected by the State of North Carolina. State funds include federal financial assistance received by the State and transferred or disbursed to non-State entities. Both Federal

and State funds maintain their identity as they are subrecipient to other organizations. Pursuant to NCGS 143C-6-23(a)(1), the terms "State grant funds" and "State grants" do not include any payment made by the Medicaid program, the State Health Plan for Teachers and State Employees, or other similar medical programs.

- (17) "Subrecipient" has the meaning in NCGS 143C-6-23(a)(3): a non-State entity that receives State funds as a grant from a grantee or from another subrecipient but does not include any non-State entity subject to the audit and other reporting requirements of the Local Government Commission.
- (18) "Unit of Local Government" has the meaning in NCGS 143C-1-1(d)(29): A municipal corporation that has the power to levy taxes, including a consolidated city-county as defined by NCGS 160B-2(1), and all boards, agencies, commissions, authorities, and institutions thereof that are not municipal corporations.

Relationships of the Parties

Independent Contractor: The Subrecipient is and shall be deemed to be an independent contractor in the performance of this Contract and as such shall be wholly responsible for the work to be performed and for the supervision of its employees. The Subrecipient represents that it has, or shall secure at its own expense, all personnel required in performing the services under this agreement. Such employees shall not be employees of, or have any individual contractual relationship with, the Recipient.

Subcontracting: The Subrecipient shall not subcontract any of the work contemplated under this Contract without prior written approval from the Recipient. Any approved subcontract shall be subject to all conditions of this Contract. Only the subcontractors or subrecipients specified in the contract documents are to be considered approved upon award of the contract. The Recipient shall not be obligated to pay for any work performed by any unapproved subcontractor or subrecipient. The Subrecipient shall be responsible for the performance of all of its subrecipients and shall not be relieved of any of the duties and responsibilities of this Contract.

Subrecipients: The Subrecipient has the responsibility to ensure that all subrecipients, if any, provide all information necessary to permit the Subrecipient to comply with the standards set forth in this Contract.

Assignment: No assignment of the Subrecipient's obligations or the Subrecipient's right to receive payment hereunder shall be permitted. However, upon written request approved by the issuing purchasing authority, the State may:

- (a) Forward the Subrecipient's payment check(s) directly to any person or entity designated by the Subrecipient, or
- (b) Include any person or entity designated by Subrecipient as a joint payee on the Subrecipient's payment check(s).

In no event shall such approval and action obligate the State to anyone other than the Subrecipient and the Subrecipient shall remain responsible for fulfillment of all contract obligations.

Beneficiaries: Except as herein specifically provided otherwise, this Contract shall inure to the benefit of and be binding upon the parties hereto and their respective successors. It is expressly understood and agreed that the enforcement of the terms and conditions of this Contract, and all rights of action relating to such enforcement, shall be strictly reserved to the Recipient and the named Subrecipient. Nothing contained in this document shall give or allow any claim or right of action whatsoever by any other third person. It is the express intention of the Recipient and Subrecipient that any such person or entity, other than the Recipient or the Subrecipient, receiving services or benefits under this Contract shall be deemed an incidental beneficiary only.

Ineligible Vendors: As provided in G.S. 147-86.59 and G.S. 147-86.82, the following companies are ineligible to contract with the State of North Carolina or any political subdivision of the State: a) any company identified as engaging in investment activities in Iran, as determined by appearing on the Final Divestment List created by the State Treasurer pursuant to G.S. 147-86.58, and b) any company identified as engaged in a boycott of Israel as determined by appearing on the List of restricted companies created by the State Treasurer pursuant to G.S. 147-86.81. A contract with the State or any of its political subdivisions by any company identified in a) or b) above shall be void ab initio.

Indemnity

Indemnification: The Subrecipient agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the Recipient, the State of North Carolina, and any of their officers, agents and employees, from any claims of third parties arising out of any act or omission of the Subrecipient in connection with the performance of this Contract to the extent permitted by law.

Default and Termination

Termination by Mutual Consent: The Parties may terminate this Contract by mutual consent with 60 days' notice to the other party, or as otherwise provided by law.

Termination Without Cause: The Recipient may terminate this contract without cause by giving 60 days written notice to the Contractor. In that event, all finished or unfinished deliverable items prepared by the Contractor under this contract shall, at the option of the Recipient, become its property and the Contractor shall be entitled to receive just and equitable compensation for any satisfactory work completed on such materials, minus any payment or compensation previously made.

Termination for Cause: If, through any cause, the Subrecipient shall fail to fulfill its obligations under this Contract in a timely and proper manner, the Recipient shall have the right to terminate this Contract by giving written notice to the Subrecipient and specifying the effective date thereof. In that event, all finished or unfinished deliverable items prepared by the Subrecipient under this Contract shall, at the option of the Recipient, become its property and the Subrecipient shall be entitled to receive just and equitable compensation for any satisfactory work completed on such materials, minus any payment or compensation previously Notwithstanding the foregoing provision. Subrecipient shall not be relieved of liability to the Recipient for damages sustained by the Recipient by virtue of the Subrecipient's breach of this agreement, and the Recipient may withhold any payment due the Subrecipient for the purpose of setoff until such time as the exact amount of damages due the Recipient from such breach can be determined.

Waiver of Default: Waiver by the Recipient of any default or breach in compliance with the terms of this Contract by the Subrecipient shall not be deemed a waiver of any subsequent default or breach and shall not be construed to be modification of the terms of this Contract unless stated to be such in writing, signed by an authorized representative of the Recipient and the Subrecipient and attached to the contract.

Availability of Funds: The parties to this Contract agree and understand that the payment of the sums specified in this Contract is dependent and contingent upon and subject to the appropriation, allocation, and availability of funds for this purpose to the Recipient.

Force Majeure: Neither party shall be deemed to be in default of its obligations hereunder if and so long as it is prevented from performing such obligations by any act of war, hostile foreign action, nuclear explosion, riot, strikes, civil insurrection, earthquake, hurricane, tornado, or other catastrophic natural event or act of God.

Survival of Promises: All promises, requirements, terms, conditions, provisions, representations, guarantees, and warranties contained herein shall survive the contract expiration or termination date unless specifically provided otherwise herein, or unless superseded by applicable federal or state statutes of limitation.

Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA): The Contractor agrees that, if the Recipient determines that some or all of the activities within the scope of this contract are subject to the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996, P.L. 104-91, as amended ("HIPAA"), or its implementing regulations, it will comply with the HIPAA requirements and will execute such agreements and practices as the Recipient may require to ensure compliance.

Compliance with Laws: The Subrecipient shall comply with all laws, ordinances, codes, rules, regulations, and licensing requirements that are applicable to the conduct of its business, including those of federal, state, and local agencies having jurisdiction and/or authority.

Equal Employment Opportunity: The Subrecipient shall comply with all federal and state laws relating to equal employment opportunity.

Confidentiality

Confidentiality: Any information, data, instruments, documents, studies or reports given to or prepared or assembled by the Subrecipient under this agreement shall be kept as confidential and not divulged or made available to any individual or organization without the prior written approval of the Recipient. The Subrecipient acknowledges that in receiving, storing, processing or otherwise dealing with any confidential information it will safeguard and not further disclose the information except as otherwise provided in this Contract.

Oversight

Access to Persons and Records: The State Auditor shall have access to persons and records as a result of all contracts or grants entered into by State agencies or political subdivisions in accordance with NCGS 147-64.7. Additionally, as the State funding authority, the Recipient and all applicable federal agencies or their agents shall have access to persons and records as a result of all contracts or grants entered into by State agencies or political subdivisions.

Record Retention: Records shall not be destroyed, purged or disposed of without the express written consent of the Recipient. 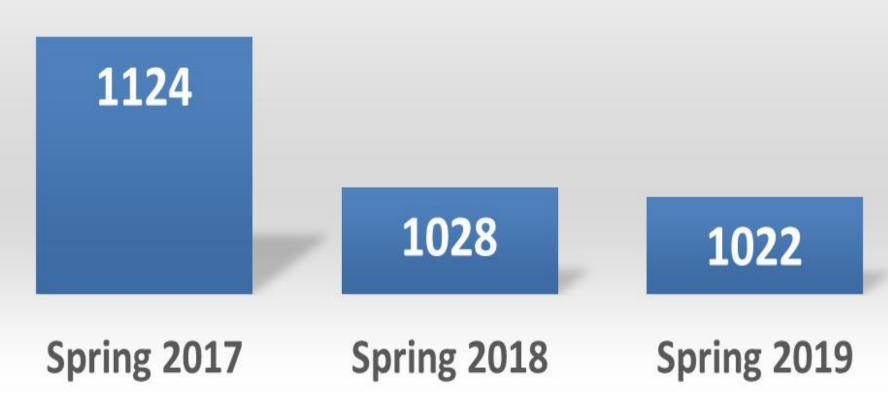

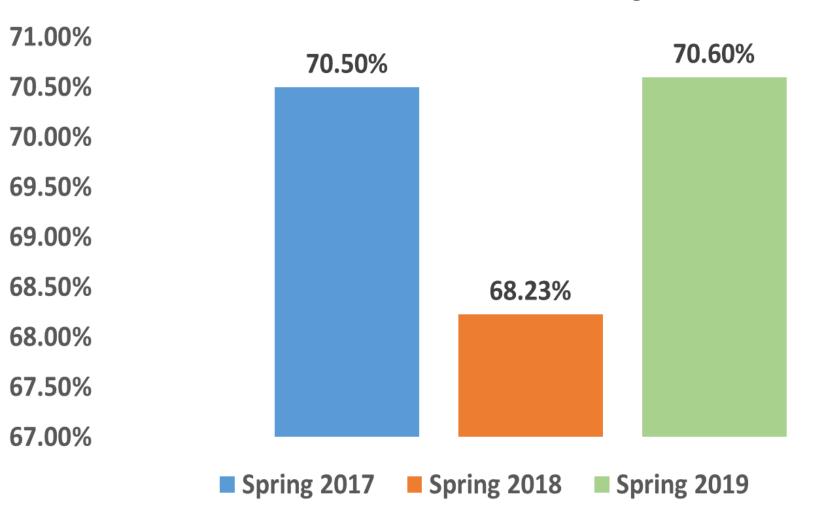

Spring Enrollment 2017-2019



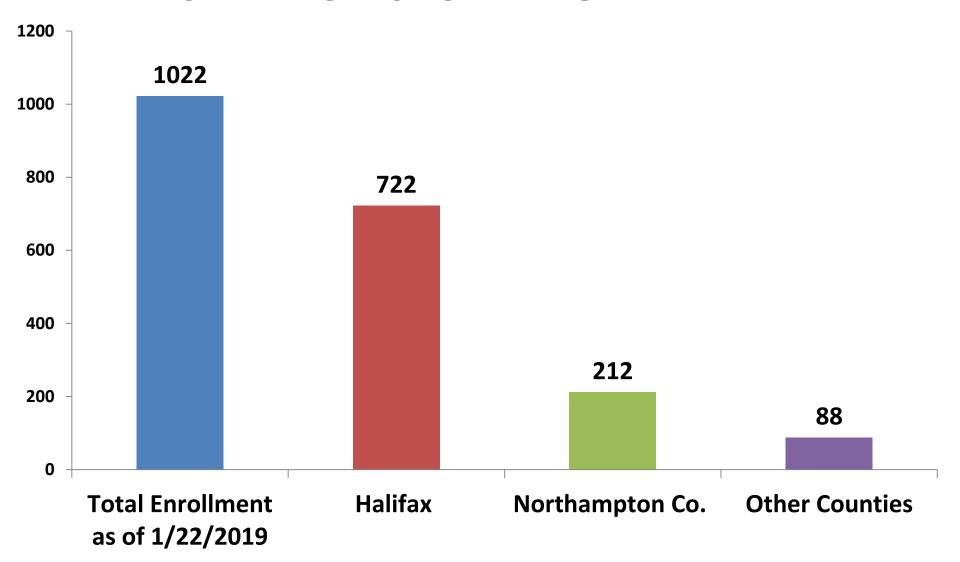

Percentage of Enrollment from Halifax County

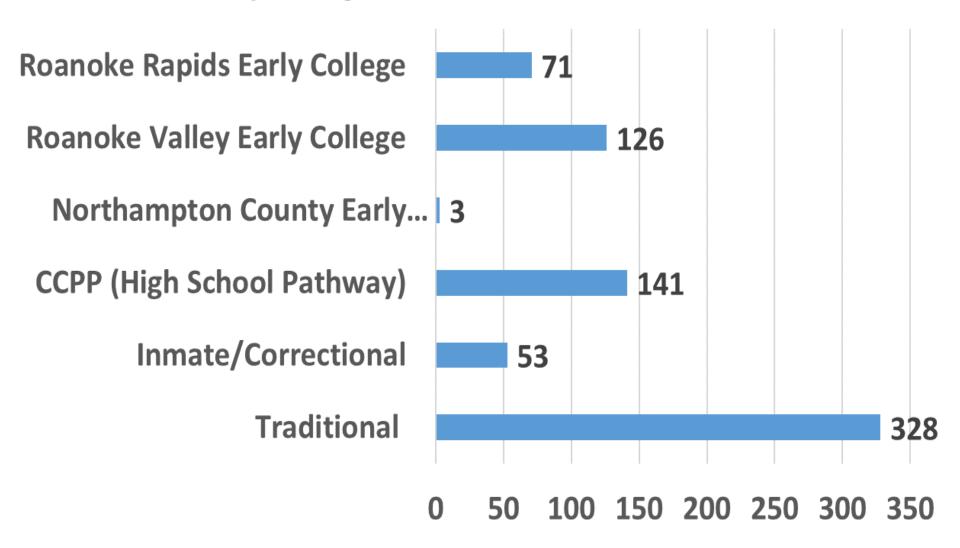

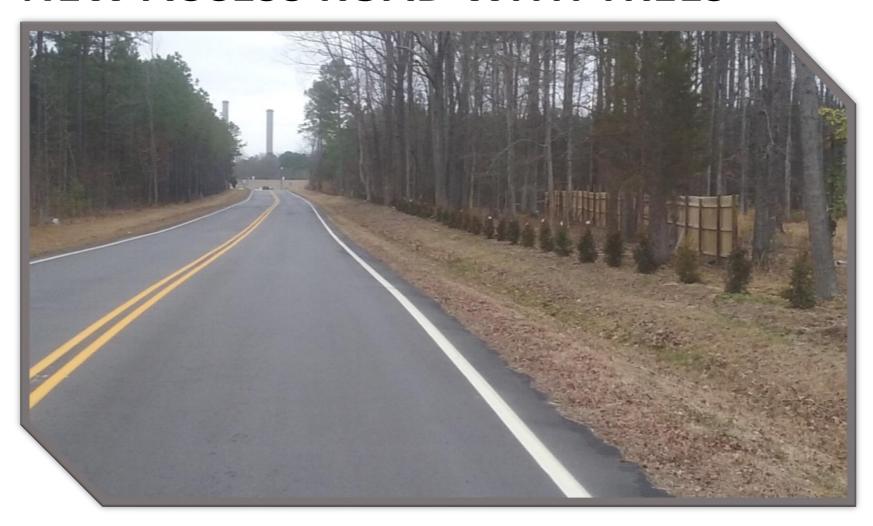

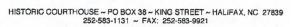

The undersigned, HALIFAX COUNTY, a body politic, created and existing under the laws of the state of North Carolina, promises to pay to the order of HALIFAX ELECTRIC MEMBERSHIP CORPORATION, ("Halifax EMC") at its principal place of business at 208 West Whitfield Street, Enfield, NC 27823, (mailing address of P. O. Box 667, Enfield, NC 27278), the sum of TWO HUNDRED FORTY THREE THOUSAND and 00/100 DOLLARS (\$243,000.00) without interest, in consecutive equal annual installments, as described further in this promissory note.

THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE PAYMENT OF THE PRINCIPAL AND INTEREST, IF ANY, IS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. Payments: The undersigned shall make three (3) annual payments in the amount of EIGHTY-ONE THOUSAND and 00/100 DOLLARS (\$81,000.00), said annual payments to begin on the 1st day of September, 2018 and on the 1st day of September of each year thereafter until paid in full. Any unpaid balance of the principal shall be due and payable on September 1st, 2020.
- 2. Default: The failure to make an annual payment when due will constitute a default of this Promissory Note. The principal of this note and any part thereof shall bear interest at the rate of 10% per annum after default until paid. In the event of default, the entire balance of the principal remaining shall, at the option of Halifax EMC, and without notice to the undersigned, be automatically due and payable. Failure to exercise this option shall not constitute a waiver of the right to exercise the same at any other time.
